

How you can use this study guide

his study guide is designed to be a companion to your *personal* study in the Holy Scriptures. It can be used for personal development and part of a small group/family bible study. Have a journal and be prepared to expand on your responses.

Pray:

- Before and after reading the chapter and questions
- Ask the Lord to reveal Himself in the words you read
- Ask the Lord to impart His Wisdom in the words you read

Read:

- Always read the scripture aloud
- You will read the assigned scripture passages multiple times, over multiple days, answering questions for each day
- If possible, use multiple translations to expand on the context of the passages you read
- You can read various translations online if you only have one printed version of the bible

Journal:

- You can use the space provided or to capture your questions, thoughts, and responses or you can use a separate journal
- Capture any scripture passages that really speak to your heart and encourage you
- To follow-up any notes from previous days as you work through each chapter over multiple days

Write

- Follow the daily guideline provided; set aside dedicated time to spend with the Lord
- Use this study guide as a tool for learning how to read and study the bible
- Be completely honest with yourself—and your responses, knowing that you are being completely honest with the Lord
