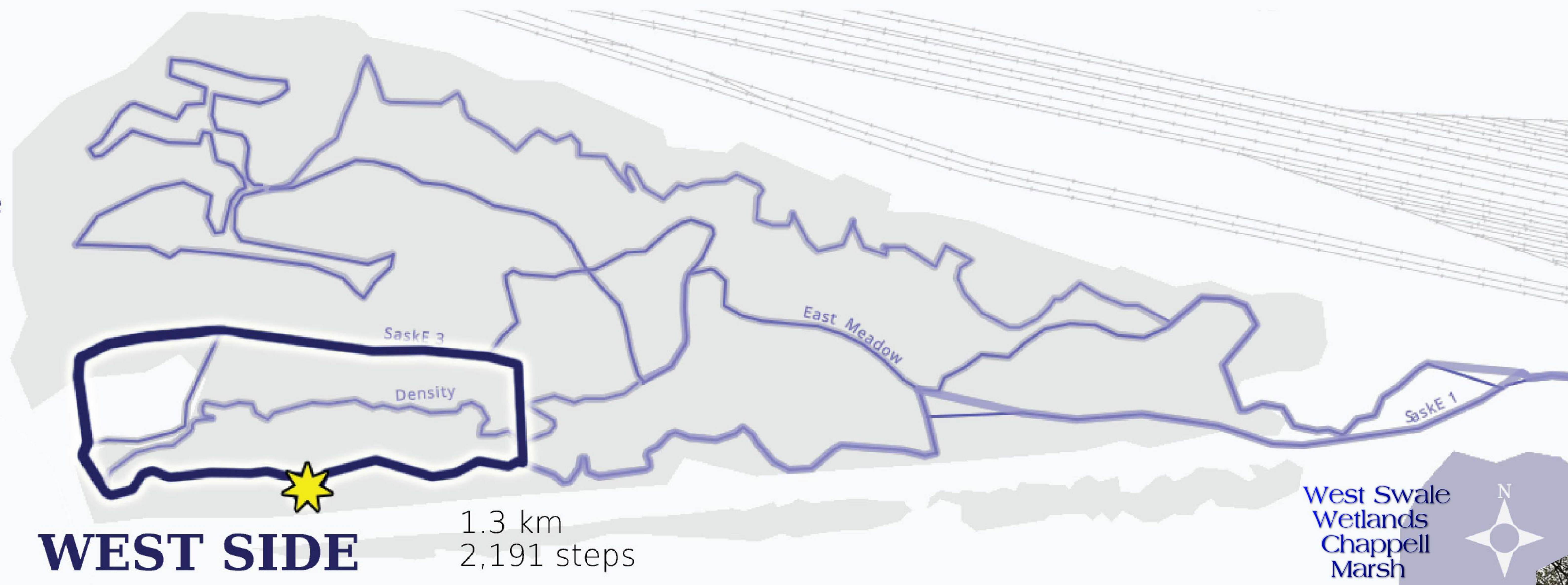


Directions

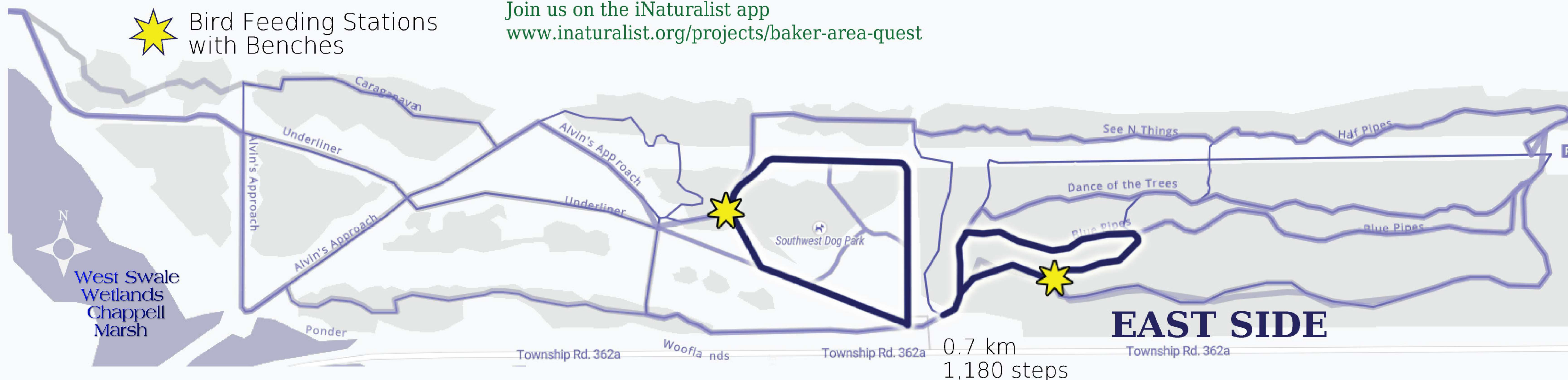
Respect the Forest
