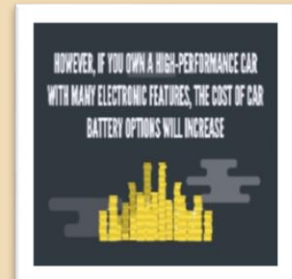
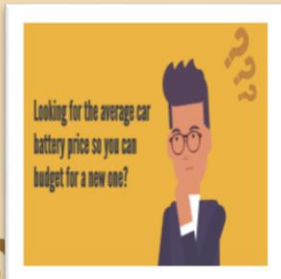


Is There A Typical Car Battery Price?
