Swedenborg and Social Media: The use of Swedenborg's theology in poems by Edwin Markham

This talk, present by scholar and descendant of American poet Edwin Markham, will focus on his staunch dedication to Swedenborg's thought and hope. Giddings' research of Markham has been both personal and professional. She is interested in his philosophical theology and social ethics and how he used poetry to exert both. In a recent conference paper, "Truly a Preacher: Religious Ideas and Themes in Poetry by the American poet Edwin Markham" she argues the strongest influences which help develop Markham's philosophical theology were from his mother and Emmanuel Swedenborg.

Giddings was born and raised in San Francisco. She earned a B.A. in Humanities and Religious Studies from Dominican University of California; a M.A. in Theology from University of San Francisco; and a M.A. in Philosophy from San Jose State University. Giddings has taught at the college level for 14 years. For the past 9 years she has taught religious studies at Santa Clara University; and 9 years at San Jose State University teaching philosophy of religion and applied ethics.
