# Joseph Smith indicted for Theft by Unlawful Taking over \$10,000.00

On August 30, 2018 the Flemingsburg Police Department was contacted by Mr. John Hyatt of Cheap's Chevrolet regarding the theft of a large sum of money from the dealership. A review of video surveillance revealed a lone perpetrator walked onto the lot of Cheap's Chevrolet and retrieved a money box which had been placed in the owner's locked vehicle. This money box was being transported from the dealership to a secure location overnight.

From the onset of this investigation it was believed an employee was involved in or committed this theft. The perpetrator walked onto the dealership, went directly to the owner's vehicle, stole this money box and fled the scene in less than three minutes. Additionally, it was determined the perpetrator stole a set of keys to the owner's vehicle from the dealership prior to the theft of this money box. The perpetrator used these stolen keys to access the vehicle without causing damage to the vehicle or alerting anyone to the theft.

Through investigation Mr. Joseph Smith, 36 years old, of Carlisle, KY has been



identified as the perpetrator. Mr. Smith was employed by Cheap's Chevrolet at the time of the theft. Mr. Smith was indicted by the Fleming County Grand Jury on December 21, 2018 for one count of Theft by Unlawful Taking over \$10,000.00, a Class C Felony.

Joseph Smith was arrested on January 4, 2019 by Officer William Thoroughman of the Carlisle Police Department and lodged in the Bourbon County Detention Center.

#### **Postal Rate Increase**



The U.S.
Postal Service will leave
50-cent forever stamps
behind Jan.
27, increasing

their price by 5 cents.

Though 2019 post office price changes vary by mailing service, the fees rolling out the last Sunday of the month will increase by 2.5 percent.

The most notable changes:
•First-class mail letter (1 ounce) will go up to 55 cents:
The nickel increase is the largest percentage rise since 1991, when postage increased from 25 to 29 cents.

•Additional letter ounce costs will decrease: Each additional ounce will drop from 21 cents to 15 cents. Mailing a 2-ounce letter, a wedding invitation's typical weight, will cost 70 cents instead of 71 cents.

•Postcard rates will remain the same: Mailing a postcard will run travelers 35 cents.

•Priority Mail prices will jump: A small box that previously cost \$7.20 will rise to \$7.90, while a medium box will jump from \$13.65 to \$14.35.

•Priority Mail Express fees will increase: Those looking to ship an envelope ASAP can expect to pay \$25.50 instead of \$24.70.

## Treasurer Ball Returns \$70,487 to Fleming County

The Kentucky State Treasury has experienced another year of record unclaimed property returns under the leadership of Treasurer Allison Ball, her office announced. Treasurer Ball has returned more unclaimed property in a three year period than any state treasurer in Kentucky history. To date, her office has returned over \$70,167,000 to Kentuckians. This record amount of returns includes \$70,487 returned to Fleming County since she took office.

"One of my favorite things to do as Treasurer is to return people's money to them," Treasurer Ball said. "I am a big believer in property rights and I am proud of the success we have seen at the Treasury in returning a record amount of property to Kentucky State Treasure."

in returning a record amount of property to Kentuckians." The Kentucky State Treasurer administers Kentucky's Unclaimed Property Fund. Unclaimed property general-

ly consists of payroll checks,



unclaimed safety deposit boxes, old life insurance policies, stocks, and more that have remained unclaimed by their owners after several years. The Treasury's Unclaimed Property Division works diligently to reunite these items with their owners, or in cases where the owner is deceased, the owner's family.
