KSP Find 156 Marijuana Plants In Fleming County Indoor Grow House

The Kentucky State Police Post 8 in Morehead received an anonymous tip of an indoor marijuana grow located in the Sherburne area of Fleming County. Through investigation, an indoor grow was located and was being operated by Robert D Leach, age 39, of Flemingsburg, KY. 156 marijuana plants were seized from the operation. Mr. Leach was arrested and charged with Cultivation of Marijuana 5 plants or more, 1st Offense and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. Mr.



Leach was lodged in the Mason County Detention Center. The case remains under investigation by Kentucky State Police Post 8.


