AGREEMENT

WAUPACA FOUNDRY, INC. ("Waupaca") and the CITY OF IRONWOOD ("City") enter into the following Agreement as concerns an "Application for Industrial Facilities Tax ("IFT") Exemption Certificate" submitted by Waupaca to the City on August 2, 2019 and thereafter approved and signed as indicated below, following public hearing on said Application.

- 1. The terms and conditions recited in this Agreement shall be made part of said Application For ITF Exemption Certificate.
- 2. The Application recites 61 new jobs expected for the 2019 new plant. Waupaca shall undertake such reasonably available efforts to retain 61 new jobs within two (2) years of project completion. Should the projected jobs not be reasonably retained and created, the City reserves the right to petition the Tax Commission to either revoke the tax exemption or decrease the remaining term of the Certificate to a shorter period determined appropriate by the City.
- 3. The Application projects a total project cost of \$3,415,404. Should said projected costs of Waupaca be less than or exceed such projected costs by more than 10%, Waupaca shall require that the City approve the revised cost with a revised Certificate issued thereafter by the Tax Commission. Waupaca shall not be penalized should it be unable to meet said anticipated project costs by reason of circumstances beyond the reasonable control of Waupaca as adversely impacting Waupaca's manufacturing operations, including, but not limited to, advancements in technology, equipment and productivity, changing market demands and competition, manufacturing and marketing costs, and national or international economic conditions. Should said costs not be reasonably met to the satisfaction of the City, the City reserves the right to petition the Tax Commission to either revoke the Tax Exemption Certificate or reduce the remaining term of the IFT Exemption Certificate to a shorter period determined appropriate by the City.
- 4. Should Waupaca close and relocate its facility before the term of the IFT Exemption Certificate has expired by reason of circumstances beyond the reasonable control of Waupaca, including, but not limited to, advancements in technology and changes in plant equipment, productivity and manufacturing methods, changing market demands and competition, manufacturing and marketing costs, and national or international economic conditions adversely impacting Waupaca's manufacturing operations and product sales, the City reserves the right to collect from Waupaca that portion of tax savings obtained by Waupaca by reason of said IFT Exemption Certificate in an amount determined reasonable and appropriate by the City.
- 5. The IFT Exemption Certificate granted Waupaca shall not be assignable without the consent of the City and the Michigan Tax Commission as applicable. Should Waupaca transfer business ownership within the term of said IFT Exemption Certificate, Waupaca must appear before the City to request approval of said

assignment of said IFT Exemption certification and remaining tax exemption benefits thereunder, which assignment approval shall not be unreasonably withheld. If the requested assignment is not consented to by the City, the property shall be returned to the regular tax rolls and the remaining period of the IFT Exemption Certificate terminated, with notice thereof provided to the State Tax Commission.

6. Waupaca shall:

- (a) Advise City staff in writing within thirty (30) days following project completion that the project is completed.
- (b) Advise City staff in writing of final project completion costs within ninety (90) days of projected completion, or the date of this letter, whichever is later.
- (c) Advise City staff in writing on or before ninety (90) days following August 5, 2019, whether it has incurred the projected employment.
