Proceedings of the Ironwood City Commission Meeting

A Regular Meeting of the Ironwood City Commission was held via Zoom on Monday, January 25, 2021 at 5:30 P.M.

A. Mayor Burchell called the Public Hearing and meeting to order at 5:30 P.M., as a remote participation meeting as authorized by Executive Order of the Governor.

The following Commissioners were in attendance: Commissioner Cayer, Corcoran, Commissioner Mildren, Commissioner Semo, and Mayor Burchell.

B. Recording of the Roll.

The following members who were in attendance indicated the physical location from which they were remotely participating in the meeting was as follows: Commissioner Cayer (City of Ironwood, Gogebic County, State of Michigan), Commissioner Corcoran (City of Ironwood, Gogebic County, State of Michigan), Commissioner Mildren (City of Ironwood, Gogebic County, State of Michigan), Commissioner Semo (City of Ironwood, Gogebic County, State of Michigan), and Mayor Burchell (City of Ironwood, Gogebic County, State of Michigan).

I. UPDATE: COVID-19 Response.

A moment of silence was given for those who were lost in our community to COVID-19.

Finance Director Paul Linn addressed the City Commission noting that the State of Michigan held its January Consensus and updated the fiscal year 2021 revenue estimates. The State is estimating an increase in sales tax revenue when comparing to the August Consensus. Treasury will update the direct revenue sharing estimates for municipalities later this month.

Community Development Director Tom Bergman noted his department had wrapped up the Michigan Survival Grant last Friday. The Upper Peninsula received 800 applicants and once we receive the list of businesses who applied from our area, they will be reviewed for completeness by Tom Bergman, Ironwood CD Director, Bessemer City Manager Charly Loper, and City of Wakefield City Manager Robert Brown and passed on to Invest U.P.. Community Development Director Bergman also noted, through the Michigan Survival Grant, there is a Live Venue Grant of up to \$40,000.00 each that the theatres will only have one week to apply for. In addition to these grants there were grants for employees effected by COVID-19, Paycheck Protection Programs through local banks, and possibly another stimulus package to be given out by Congress. Mr. Bergman urged area businesses, if they need help, to contact him.

Public Safety Lieutenant Adam Clemens addressed the City Commission stating Gogebic County continues to roll out vaccinations and have administered 2,000 doses through Gogebic County. He also noted the positive cases have declined to 47.

M. Manager's Report.

City Manager Scott B. Erickson verbally gave the Manager's report noting the following items:

- *Recognized Department of Public Safety and everyone who helped during the recent fire downtown, they did an excellent job in containing it.
- *The Department of Public Works repaired a water break on Sunnyside today and will be working on the 16" main to repair a leak tomorrow.
- *The dasher boards are being put in at the Pat O'Donnell Civic Center.
- *City Staff has been working on the six (6) year Capital Improvement Plan, which will be going to the Planning Commission for approval.
- *A work session will be scheduled for February 8th to discuss COVID-19 leave.
- *The budget process will begin shortly with the City Commission and will start off with a work session scheduled for February 22nd for Goal Setting with the final Goal Setting work session on March 8th.

N. Other Matters.

Commissioner Semo questioned City Staff regarding the park located on the north side of the highway. Community Development Director Tom Bergman replied by noting the project is still moving forward, but the Park & Recreation Commission would like to prioritize the park needs for new equipment and where future parks should be located. Additional comments were received.

Re: Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) 2021-2027

The requirement for capital budgeting and creation of a Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) for the following six fiscal years is found in the Michigan Planning Enabling Act (Public Act 33 of 2008, as amended). Capital budgeting has two elements. The first is a Capital Improvements Plan, and the second is the incorporation of that plan into the annual budget and future budget forecasts. The Capital Improvement Plan is a six year schedule of all proposed major capital improvement projects including project priorities, costs estimates, methods of financing, and annual estimated operating and maintenance costs for the proposed projects. Each year the Capital Improvement Plan is revised for next fiscal year.

Including the Capital Improvement Plan in the annual budget, and future budget forecasts, is primarily for the purpose of adjusting the multi-year program of projects to changing needs and circumstances. It also ensures that projects proposed and planned for are actually completed. At the end of each fiscal year, the projects completed during that year are removed from the plan and an additional year's projects are added. The Capital Improvement Plan is designed to be amended on an annual basis. Projects can be added or subtracted as the needs and resources of the community adjust.

Recommendations

Re: Late Penalty Waiver Request

A written request has been received from Kristine Kuker to waive the late penalty fee, in the amount of \$35.89, that was added to her tax bill for failure to pay her 2020 summer property taxes by the August 10th due date. The tax bill is for property at 223 S. Curry Street (property #: 27-52-22-405-300).

Per chapter 10 of the City Charter, the Treasurer shall forward a statement of taxes due by first class mail addressed to the several owners of the property upon which taxes are assessed, according to the names of such owners and their addresses as indicated on the tax roll. Such notice shall be deemed sufficient for the payment of-all taxes on the tax roll. Failure on the part of the Treasurer to give said notice shall not invalidate the taxes on the tax roll nor release the person or property assessed from the penalty provided by State Law for nonpayment of taxes. City taxes are due July 1. Along with any other taxes billed at that time they become delinquent if not paid by August 10.

State of Michigan statute states that failure to send or receive the notice does not prejudice the right to collect or enforce the payment of the tax. The statute provides the governing body the authority to impose a late penalty for delinquent taxes. The City Commission annually authorizes the City Treasurer, via resolution, to impose a 3% late penalty fee for delinquent taxes. The statute also provides the governing body the authority to waive the penalty.

The attached 5-year history report shows the taxes on this property are typically paid on the due date, sometimes a day or two before. This property had a late penalty applied three (3) other times in the past twenty (20) years, 2000, 2002 and 2004.

In fairness to others who paid their taxes late and were assessed the penalty, it is my recommendation to deny the taxpayer's request to waive the late penalty fee.

Introduction

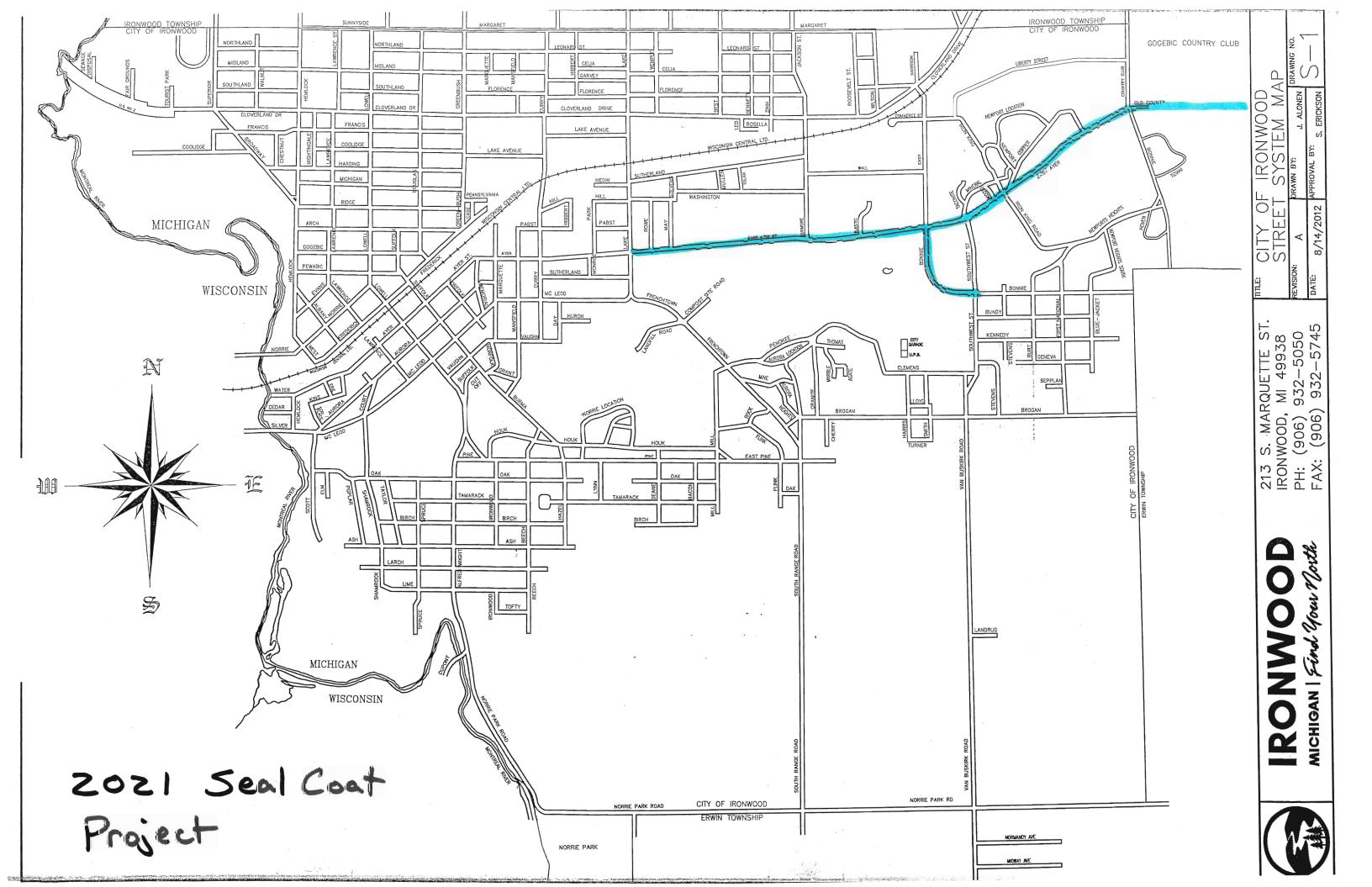
The Ironwood City Commission is requested to authorize bids to be received for the 2021 Pavement Chip Seal Project. This project will be bid with the Gogebic County chip seal project to hopefully reduce cost by having the two projects bid together. The 2021 chip seal project locations are shown on the attached location map.

Analysis & Background

Pavement chip sealing is a pavement maintenance technique which is designed to preserve and extend the longevity of a street. The pavement chip seal process applies a surface coating of stone/chips to an existing roadway to seal the street surface thus reducing the normal wear and tear and extending the useful life of the roadway. The City of Ironwood has used this maintenance technique on a number of roadways in the past and it has performed very well. The proposed locations for this year's chip seal project is identified on the attached map.

Recommendation

It is recommended to authorize bids to be received for the 2021 pavement chip seal project.

Introduction

The Ironwood City Commission has identified the paving of local city streets as a high priority for the city. A 2021 local street paving project has been identified and is proposed per the attached location map.

Analysis & Background

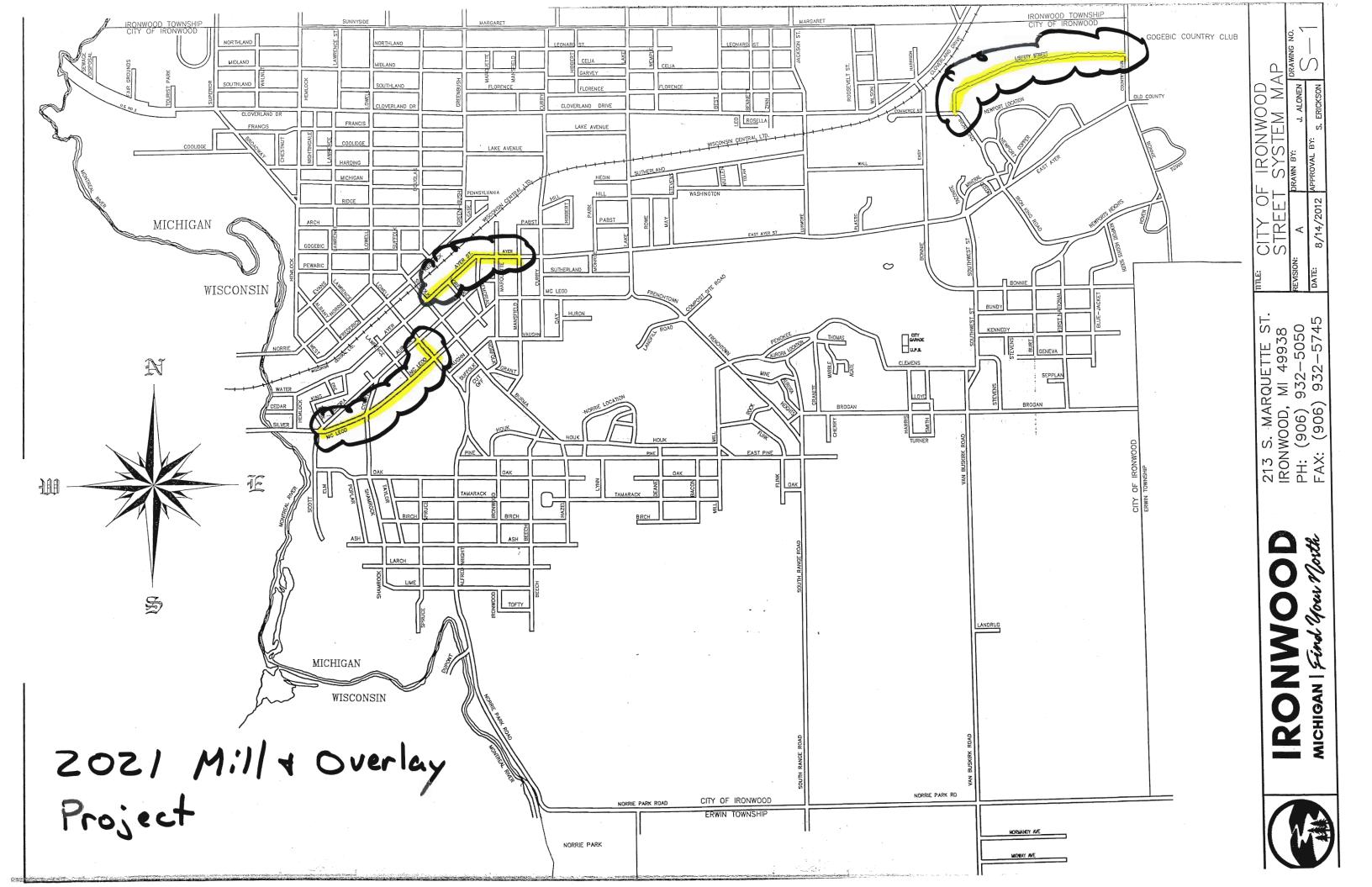
The City of Ironwood has had an aggressive local street paving program over the past few years. The City has identified the following locations for the 2021 mill and overlay project: McLeod Avenue from Silver Street to Lowell Street; Lowell Street from McLeod Ave. to Aurora Street; Ayer Street from Suffolk Street to Mansfield Street; and Liberty Street from Country Club Road to Commerce Street.

This project would consist of pulverizing or milling the existing asphalt street surface, asphalt street paving, pavement striping and shouldering the pavement edge. A section of west end of McLeod Avenue will also have curbing and sidewalk replacement included.

The funding for this project will come from a combination of major/local street funds and the general fund. The estimated cost of the street paving portion of this project is \$ 400,000.00. There will be some additional work included with the project bid to include paving of asphalt street patches associated with previous water/sewer main repairs. The funding for the utility street patch work will be from water/sewer utility funds.

Recommendation

It is recommended to authorize bids to be received for the 2021 Local Street paving project.
