A Regular Meeting of the Ironwood City Commission was held via Zoom on Monday, April 12, 2021 at 5:30 P.M., along with a regular Public Hearing at 5:25 P.M..

- 1. Mayor Burchell called the public hearing to order at 5:25 P.M.
- 2. Recording of the Roll

The following members who were in attendance indicated the physical location from which they were remotely participating in the meeting were as follows: Commissioner Cayer (City of Ironwood, Gogebic County, State of Michigan), Commissioner Corcoran (City of Ironwood, Gogebic County, State of Michigan), Commissioner Mildren (City of Ironwood, Gogebic County, State of Michigan), Commissioner Semo (City of Ironwood, Gogebic County, State of Michigan), and Mayor Burchell (City of Ironwood, Gogebic County, State of Michigan).

She also stated there was approximately 10 dogs that were taken and then returned to the homeowner. Ms. Fuchs wanted an update on what transpired between animal control and the homeowner. July 27<sup>th</sup> is the first opportunity for a public hearing and potential adoption. He brought up nuisance ordinance that will help to reduce odor issues in the City of Ironwood. The Michigan Supreme Court allows municipalities to regulate the Medical Marijuana operations under zoning.

### **SUMMARY OF MARCH 2021 FINANCIAL REPORTS**

The Revenue and Expenditure Report and the Cash and Investment Summary Report are included in the agenda packet for April 26, 2021. Following is a summary of each report.

### **Revenue and Expenditure Report**

As of March 31, 2021, we are approximately 75% through our current fiscal year. The revenues and expenditures of most funds are in-line with this benchmark. Major Funds with large variations from the 75% benchmark (and applicable reasoning) are as follows:

- Major and Local Street Funds: Expenditures at approximately 53% We have a large amount budgeted for street construction and maintenance. This activity will pick over the next few months. Winter maintenance and snow hauling expenditures are less than normal due to below average snowfall.
- 2. <u>Water Fund:</u> Expenditures at 63% We have a large amount budgeted for service line replacement, which is required by the State of Michigan. This effort has begun and will continue in the spring. We have also submitted grant applications to help fund this work.
- 3. <u>Sewer Fund:</u> Expenditures at 64% We have a large amount budgeted for sewer main replacement. This project has recently started.

### **Cash and Investment Summary Report**

The Cash and Investment Summary Report shows the activity for the month of March, sorted by fund. Notable items are as follows:

- 1. <u>General Fund Cash:</u> Account balance increased due to receiving a large grant reimbursement for the Downtown Square Project.
- 2. <u>Retiree Health Care Fund MERS Investments:</u> Account balance increased due to the recording of the third quarter investment gain.

#### **Background**

Mr. Bill Leppala of Tula Toilets, property owner at the NW Corner of Hwy. 2 and Walnut Street, Parcel #52-16-483-080, is in violation of the City of Ironwood, Michigan Zoning Ordinance Section 34-152.- Permitted Uses. All permitted uses (as listed in section 34-152) in the C-3 highway commercial district must be conducted wholly in a permanent, fully enclosed building, except as otherwise stated, except public utility structures not usually so enclosed and all permitted uses shall have plans and specifications submitted in accordance with article IX of this chapter.

Section 34-7(2) sets forth enforcement procedures for violation of the zoning ordinance. The zoning administrator may issue up to two notices of ordinance violation with time allowed for compliance. If the property owner fails to comply following the issuance of two notices, the city commission shall issue a show cause hearing notice for a special hearing by interested parties upon the recommendation of the zoning administrator.

Currently the property owner is storing multiple vehicles, commercial trailers (with pump tanks), and portable toilets. There is no permanent primary structure on the property. The Zoning office has sent two letters notifying the property owner of the violations.

Attached to this memo are the two letters as well as photos of the site.

#### Recommendation

The staff recommendation is to set a Show Cause Hearing for the next regular City Commission Meeting on May 10, 2021 at 5:25pm.



The City DPW Vehicle Maintenance Department contacted the Fabick Cat repair shop in Negaunee, Michigan (our closest Cat repair shop) for brakes and caliper replacement for Backhoe #85.

Fabick Cat quoted \$6,040.58 for the initial repair work. During disassembly of the brakes and rear-end housing, Fabick Cat discovered significant deterioration and damage to bearings, gaskets, vee belt, pins and more. The additional cost of this work brought the final repair cost to \$12,365.61.

The additional repairs were necessary to avoid future repairs to the items listed by Fabick Cat. After the work was completed the final bill was \$12,365.61.

It is recommended to approve the repair cost to Backhoe #85 in the amount of \$12,365.61 as completed by Fabick Cat. The funding will be from the Equipment Fund.

Included in your packet is a broken-down description of repairs, parts and labor by Fabick Cat.

This moratorium expired and municipalities are in the process of disconnecting service for delinquency. City staff are working with many accounts regarding payment agreements and referring them to various funding agencies that have received additional revenue to help with various utility accounts.

The Ironwood City Commission passed a resolution to temporarily waive reconnection fees and penalties regarding monthly water bills effective March 10, 2020. Since then, the City of Ironwood has a total lost revenue of \$82,684.55 for utility penalties not charged. I am requesting your direction regarding the temporary waiving of the reconnection fees and penalties on monthly utility bills.

Thank you for the opportunity to provide this proposal for assisting the City of Ironwood with the development of an application for funding assistance with USDA Rural Development. As we have discussed, there are likely upcoming opportunities for federal money to become available for the infrastructure stimulus bill being discussed at the federal level right now. In order to be ready to acquire that funding through USDA Rural Development, a Preliminary Engineering Report and USDA RD Application will need to be performed ahead of time in order to move quickly when the funding is available.

The Michigan Guide 2 Rural Development form details the required elements of a Rural Development application. The Michigan Guide 2 effective as of this correspondence date is incorporated into this proposal by reference and will serve as the scope of services. ## Introduction

The Ironwood City Commission recently discussed the existing "No Parking" designation on the south side of Norrie Street between Lowell Street and Hemlock Street and the location of the centerline stripe in relation to the currently permitted parking along the north side of the street.

Upon reviewing the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) and standards for driving lane widths for collector streets, such as Norrie Street, the following has been determined:

- The pavement width necessary to designate "on-street" parking for Norrie Street would require a pavement width of 31 ft to allow for two 11 ft lanes and one 9 ft parking lane. The current pavement width of Norrie Street is 28.5 ft.
- 2. The current centerline location on Norrie Street provides for a 15 ft. wide west bound lane and a 13.5 ft east bound lane. If the centerline striping were to be shifted further to the south this would provide for an 11 ft east bound lane (no parking on the south side) and a 17.5 ft

- west bound lane (which would provide for a 6.5 ft parking lane, which is 2.5 ft short of the required 9 ft. lane)
- 3. Based on street design standards, Norrie Street does not have enough width to properly establish a designated parking area along the north side of the street.

## Options to Consider:

- 1. Designate this section of Norrie Street as No Parking both sides.
- 2. Remove No Parking Designation
- 3. Leave as is
- 4. Move Centerline stripe 2.5 ft to the south per original striping layout
- 5. Other





## Introduction

The Ironwood City Commission recently discussed what controls are currently in-place to manage the number of dogs/cats that are allowed in a residence in the City of Ironwood. There are two local controlling entities, the City of Ironwood and Gogebic County, that have regulatory authority regarding animal control, including dogs. Gogebic County has an animal control enforcement ordinance (also establishing an animal control officer) and the City of Ironwood has ordinance controls identified in City Ordinance Chapter 6 – Animals, Article II. Dogs/Cats and Zoning Ordinance Section 34-224(d) Prohibited Home Occupations (Kennels)\_. Both ordinances provide direction on the management of "kennels" and other related animal nuisances but do not provide for specific limitations on the number of domestic pets that can be kept at a residence.

If the City Commission would want to consider establishing a specific limitation on the number of domestic animals that could be kept at a residence in the City of Ironwood, additional research and proposed ordinance language could be developed.



February 3, 2021 at approximately 8:00 p.m., the City Water Facilities Coordinator was alerted of low water system pressure. It was discovered that the lower bearing of the electric pump motor in Highlift Booster Pump #1 had released from the lower housing. This was causing water leakage and damage to the pump.

The repairs to Highlift booster #1 were determined to be urgent for factors of fire protection, flushing and possible large water main leaks. Booster Pump #1 is necessary to give the City the needed water during these unforeseen events.
