Re: 2017-003 Garage Variance at 1121 N. Hemlock Street

Request

Before the Board is a request to erect a 720 sq ft garage at 1121 N. Hemlock Street. The property is Zoned R-1 Single Family Residential District. There is one variance that would be required in order to grant this request. It is explained below.

Variance: Section 34-53(7) of the Zoning Ordinance states: One (1) accessory building, in addition to the principal garage, is permitted, but may not exceed two hundred (200) square feet. The applicant is requesting an additional garage to their already existing 672 sq. ft. garage.

Per Section 34-285(6)(b) A non-use variance, which applies to the variance request listed, may be allowed by the ZBA only in cases where there is reasonable evidence of practical difficulty in the official record of the hearing and that all of the following conditions are met:

- i. Extraordinary circumstances. There are exceptional or extraordinary circumstances or conditions applying to the property in question that do not apply generally to other properties in the same zoning district. Exceptional or extraordinary circumstances or conditions include:
 - 1. Exceptional narrowness, shallowness or shape of a specific property on the effective date of the ordinance from which this chapter is derived.
 - 2. By reason of exceptional topographic conditions or other extraordinary situation on the land, building or structure.
 - 3. By reason of the use or development of the property immediately adjoining the property in question; whereby the literal enforcement of the requirements of this chapter would involve practical difficulties.

4. Any other physical situation on the land, building or structure deemed by the ZBA to be extraordinary.

ii. *Practical difficulty/substantial justice*. Compliance with the strict letter of the restrictions governing area, setbacks, frontage, height, bulk, density, or other dimensional provisions would unreasonably prevent the use of the property. Granting of a requested variance or appeal would do substantial justice to the applicant as well as to other property owners in the district and such variance is necessary for the preservation and enjoyment of a substantial property right similar to that possessed by other properties in the same zoning district and in the vicinity. The possibility of increased financial return shall not of itself be deemed sufficient to warrant a variance.

iii. *Impact on surrounding neighborhood.* The variance will not be significantly detrimental to adjacent property and the surrounding neighborhood or interfere with or discourage the appropriate development, continued use, or value of adjacent properties and the surrounding neighborhood.

iv. Public safety and welfare. The granting of the variance will not impair an adequate supply of light and air to adjacent property or unreasonably increase the congestion in public streets, or increase the danger of fire or endanger the public safety, comfort, morals or welfare of the inhabitants of the city.

v. *Not self created.* The immediate practical difficulty causing the need for the variance request was not self-created by the applicant.

Per Section 34-287 The ZBA may impose, in writing, specific conditions with an affirmative decision pursuant to Public Act No. 110 of 2006 (MCL 125.3101 et seq.)

Per Section 34-286(1) A majority of the entire membership of the ZBA (3 members) is required in order to decide in favor of the applicant.

Recommendation

The property owner already has an accessory building on the property and has the ability to add an additional accessory building under 200 sq. ft. Also he could increase the existing garage to 900 sq. ft. and still be within the requirements of the ordinance. The request to build an additional building over 200 sq. ft. would not meet the criteria of an overly burdensome hardship.

Other residents in the neighborhood have similar sized garages to the applicant's existing garage and very few have more than one unless it is because they have a garage attached to the house. The request would be outside the normal building pattern of the neighborhood.

Impact on the neighborhood is somewhat subjective and testimony from the public may help with determining this part of the decision.

This would be a self-created hardship. The property owner has other alternatives that meet the requirements of the ordinance.

The recommendation of staff would be to deny the variance request as it does not meet the requirements of a variance request as stated in the zoning ordinance.

A recommendation by city staff is only a recommendation. The decision solely rests on the Zoning Board of Appeals. There may be additional information or testimony during the hearing that will influence the decision.

Motion: To **Grant/Deny** variance a to Section 34-53(7) of the Zoning Ordinance to allow an additional accessory building over 200 sq. ft.

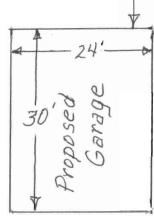

- 5. Citizens wishing to address the Commission regarding Items <u>not on</u> the Agenda (three-minute limit): Bill Martell discussed the Little League Field and asked for support to plant grass on the Little League Field. He also passed out a drawing of the Little League field.
- 6. Items for Discussion and Consideration:
 - **A.** Public listening session to hear comment on the Medical Marijuana Facilities Licensing Act (2016 PA 281-283) and whether or not the City of Ironwood should consider adopting an ordinance to allow any of the Marijuana Facilities identified in PA 281.: Chair Davey opened up for public comment and read the Public Listening Session Procedure. Director Bergman gave an overview of the new law.

David Shultice of 657 Lake Ave. addressed the Commission and discussed a building that he has an offer on for Marijuana use in the Industrial Park. He also discussed the benefits to the community. The Commission asked him questions about what types of jobs and what he does with banking since banks are federally supported. He also talked about licensing fees and property taxes that the City of Ironwood will see. He also discussed the basement operations will not have a market to sell to and will disappear.

Chandra Portell of 320 Aurora St. had talked about being in favor of cannabis and stated that she is trying to get marijuana to open recreationally. She then passed out a guide to the Commission discussing the pros with passing this.

Rich Duncanson 104 Ceccons Rd. and other multiple addresses in the City of Ironwood. He discussed the importance of the City to get a larger tax base to help get amenities that attract families. He gave some benefits of marijuana and talked about the City of Ironwood needing to identify the correct zoning district to allow marijuana facilities.

City of Ironwood Commissioner Semo asked Mr. Duncanson's opinion on other current grow operations and what the effects would be if the law was passed. Duncanson stated that the current grow operations would most likely cease to exist. He also discussed organics vs. non-organics.

Linda Tilly 220 E. Ayer St. discussed the need for zoning it properly if passed due to bad odors and could make people move away from the area.

- 7. Other Business: Director Bergman asked whether the planning and zoning news packets and the Commission agreed to continue the subscription.

- B. Concurs with August 15, 2015 as being the date of Substantial Completion on the Local Project.
- C. Concurs with June 15, 2016 as being the date of Final Completion on the Local Project
- D. Agrees that after final payment of the invoices approved at the September 11, 2017 City Commission meeting, there will be \$569,399.63 in the water portion loan budget of the project. The City requests the remaining loan funds be ordered and applied as an extra payment on the water Rural Development loan after the final expenses are covered, since the project is complete. The City understands these funds will be deposited into the City Water Construction account and Rural Development will provide more directions on how to make the extra payment.
- E. Agrees that after final payment of the invoices approved at the September 11, 2017 City Commission meeting, there will be \$216,017.55 in the sewer portion grant budget of the project. The City requests the remaining grant funds be cancelled after the final expenses are covered, since the project is complete. The City understands Rural Development will provide more directions on how to close out the construction account.
