Car batteries typically last around 3 to 5 years. Planning ahead means you can research the <u>best</u> <u>place to buy a car battery</u> to get a good deal. The extensive variety on the market means there's no simple answer to which battery is the best for you, but essentially, you should establish what size battery you need and where the terminal locations are. Find this information in your car's manual or online.

Also consider how your car's used. Traditional lead acid batteries are good for many drivers, but if you don't use your car for long periods, say, or have lots of high-end electronics, then an Absorbed Glass Matt (AGM) option, while initially more expensive, will last longer and so may be the best price car battery for your requirements.



Finally, you'll often get the <u>best car battery UK</u> from a busy stockist – even brand-new unused batteries deteriorate over time, so pick sellers with high turnovers of stock.
