

# **How to Choose A Private Tutor for Your child**

## **Qualifications, experience and the rate of success**

You should do extensive research on the tutor's reputation. If you can, get in touch with past employers (or send them an email). While relevant qualifications are essential and experience is an advantage but you shouldn't be too impressed by these two aspects. Although many tutors are highly qualified and experienced, they usually fail to build a rapport with students or give the information that is needed.

If possible, do some research about the success the tutor has been able to accomplish with previous or current students. It might not be a smart idea to hire anyone through your country's yellow pages, but instead look for recommendations via word of mouth from parents or teachers.

It is essential to take into consideration the best method for tutoring, as well as the way they work with other teachers and trainers in the child's education. It will also depend on the subject the tutor is instructing. Certain parents might only receive private tuition in languages and math.

## **Goals and Plans**

A wonderful saying is "A man with a plan" You, as a parent you should inquire with your tutor about the lesson plan, their methodology and the objectives they have set for the student. They will also provide the progress report and any milestones. Since private tuition is intended to help in specific areas or focus solely on particular subject areas, it might require you to set goals that are more rigid than the standard curriculum.

It is important to know what your tutor is looking for in addition to interviewing them in depth make sure you have regular talks with them so you know how your child is performing. It's a good idea to offer you a trial period in case your child isn't comfortable with strangers or you're interested in trying out an instructor's method of teaching.
