CITY OF IRONWOOD 2019 OUTLOOK

It looks like 2019 will be another busy and exciting year for the City of Ironwood. City staff and City officials will be working on several projects and initiatives over the next few months. A few of the items currently in the works for next year include:

- ✓ Completing the update of the City Zoning Ordinance. This is a significant effort that will identify how the City will move forward in the coming years. The zoning ordinance update will incorporate the direction the community previously identified in the City Comprehensive Plan (see City website at www.cityofironwood.org).

- ✓ Continued street improvements. Street improvements are currently being planned for Country Club Road as well as a section of Ayer Street from Lake Street west to Curry Street. The City will also continue to include some street overlays and crack sealing around town.

- ✓ Residential Blighted House Demolition. City staff is pursuing additional grant funding to financially assist with the demolition of ten additional blighted residential properties in the community.

- ✓ With the recent passing of the new recreational marijuana laws in Michigan, possible revisions to City ordinances will be evaluated to properly manage the commercial interests in this area.

- ✓ Michigan Department of Natural Resources Trust Fund Grants have been submitted for the development of a new children's playground north of US 2 and the development of mountain bike trails in Miners Memorial Heritage Park. This is a competitive grant process which the City will find out towards the end of this year if the projects have been selected for funding.

- ✓ The Downtown "First Friday" events will continue in 2019. These Downtown events have been well received and are being planned again for next year.

PUBLIC NOTICES

By Ironwood Public Safety Department

No Parking on Ironwood City Streets

October 31 – April 1 2 AM -7 AM

Vehicles must not be parked on City right-of-way. For the safety of your vehicles, park inside your property line. Vehicles found in violation of this notice will be towed away at owner's expense and subject to fine. The City will not be liable for any damage to cars illegally parked.



Cleaning Snow and Ice from Private or Public Property

*No person shall shovel, push, plow or move snow or ice or otherwise cause to deposit any snow or ice in or upon the traveled portion of any street or sidewalk.

*No person shall remove or cause to remove any snow or ice on to any or across any street or any roadway.

*No person shall deposit or cause to deposit any snow or ice in any manner, which obstructs the safety vision of a driver of a motor vehicle.

*A person who violates these sections upon conviction shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Notice-Sidewalks to be Cleared

Property owners in the C-2 Sidewalk Maintenance Area of the City of Ironwood are required to keep clear all sidewalks adjoining such lot or premises from snow and ice within twenty four (24) hours after the fall or formation. Failure to do so shall be deemed a violation of the Ordinance and may cause the sidewalks to be cleared by the City of Ironwood at the owners or occupant's expense. PROPERTY TAX PAYMENT SCHEDULE

Winter taxes, including a 1% administration fee, are levied December 1st each year. They become past due if not paid by February 15th. Please note that payments must be received by the City before 3:30 p.m. on February 15th to avoid a 3% late penalty. Any outstanding balance summer or winter taxes will be turned over to the Gogebic County Treasurer as delinquent on March 1st.

Payments are accepted via the following:

- At the payment window located on the first floor of the City Municipal Building
- In the indoor drop box located next to the payment window (referenced above)
- In the City's outdoor drop box (silver) located in front of the City Municipal Building

CITY, VILLAGE & TOWNSHIP REVENUE SHARING

For fiscal year 2019, the State of Michigan Legislature continued the City, Village, and Township Revenue Sharing (CVTRS) program. Each eligible local unit must meet all of the requirements of Accountability and Transparency in order to receive the full CVTRS payments. To qualify for CVTRS payments, a local unit must provide Treasury with certain required documents, as well as make the required documents available for public viewing in the city, village, or township clerk's office or post them on a publicly accessible Internet site. The required documents include: 1) City, Village, and Township Revenue Sharing and County Incentive Program Certification (form 4886),

2) Citizen's Guide, 3) Performance Dashboard, 4) Debt Service Report, and 5) Projected Budget Report. The City of Ironwood's required documents associated with the CVTRS program are available for viewing in the City Clerk's office located in the Ironwood Municipal Building, 213 S.
