Annie's Sweets will be on hand with their cream candy, Bourbon balls, and other sweet treats. There will be plenty of Fresh Apple Cider and lots of other free samples of food items. Also, there will be a large variety of mums available along with other fall decorating favorites such as fodder, straw, and pumpkins.

"This year we're going to do something special on Saturday," commented Leon. "We're going to have a Chicken Barbecue Benefit to raise funds to assist with a project sponsored by Christian Aid Ministries out of Berlin, Ohio." Leon went on to explain that his sisters, along with assistance from his mother, are putting together Layette Bundles to be shipped to refugee camps in countries such as Romania, Haiti, Nicaragua,



and other areas. The "Baby Bundles" include blankets, cloth or flannel diapers, sleepers, onesies, plastic diaper pants, socks, and a baby cap. These items are then bundled up in a larger blanket, secured with diaper pins, and marked for a girl or boy. "Imagine being a new mom in a refugee camp and not having the supplies needed for a new infant. We're hoping to help as much as we can and wanted to give the community a chance to pitch in if they want to help these struggling mothers with infants," stated Leon. On Saturday, they will be offering a plate lunch special consisting of Grilled Barbeque Chicken, Baked Beans, a choice of Macaroni or Potato Salad, Dinner Roll, Dessert, and a drink for \$12.00. All proceeds will go to the Layette Bundle Project to help purchase the items for the bundles. Gordon's Food Service and Walnut Creek Foods will be partnering with the Dinner Bell to help with the benefit. There will also be a "Donation Jar" available for anyone wishing to give a donation to help these infants.

In addition to the plate lunch, the Deli will be open to fix any of the Dinner Bell's hot or cold sandwich favorites! There will be fresh baked goods to take home or to enjoy with your lunch. Near the close of the day, winners of the Door Prizes will be announced, so be sure to sign up for a chance to win

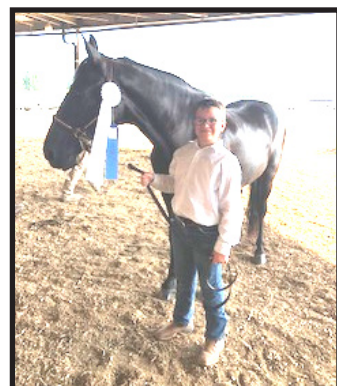
Local Youth Participate in State 4-H Horse Show
