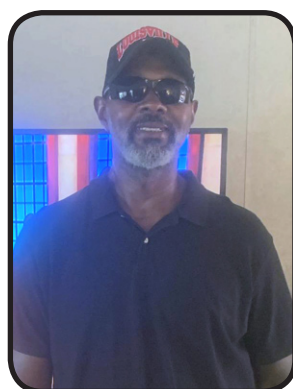

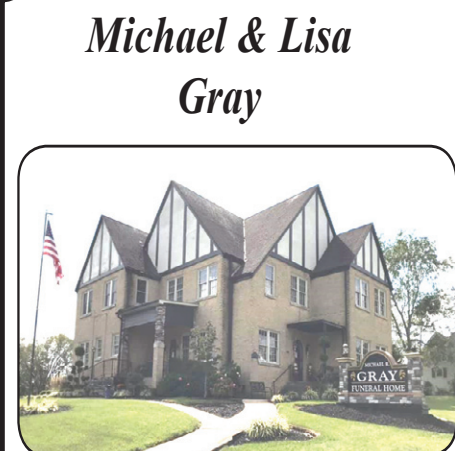
Burial was in the Mt. Carmel Cemetery.

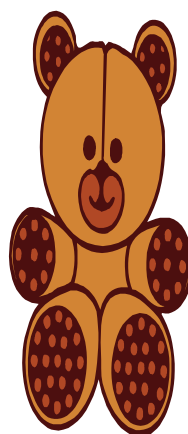
