At present, <u>Craigslist</u> (formalized as craigslist) is one of the <u>best-classified ads websites</u> in the United States. In 2000, Craigslist began spreading out to other cities in Canada and the United States and it currently encompasses more than 70 nations. There is no gainsaying that Craigslist has expanded its operations and now it is offering services in English, German, French, Spanish, Dutch, Portuguese, and Italian languages.
