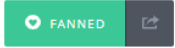

Who We Are

Americans All uses a unique storytelling tool to facilitate legacy preservation, enable students to communicate better and help small businesses succeed. Schools receive ongoing revenue from **Business Legacy Partner** and **Social Legacy Network** membership fees. Our 33-year-old nonprofit foundation's program helps students and their families record and archive **stories** to recognize the contributions all groups have made to our nation's growth and help current and future generations appreciate their ethnic and cultural identity.

Schools and their students, teachers and alumni can publish stories on our **Heritage Honor Roll** for free. These stories can contain photos and videos and be published in multiple languages. A section of the online story can be password protected, and a shortened version can be printed out in an 8½" x 11" template to be shared with family and friends. After registration, the story can be completed over time. Schools can also access existing and future social studies information from the program.

What We Do

We aim to tie the compelling need to preserve legacies with the essential goal of imparting good citizenship skills. Storytelling is key to the transfer of wisdom, knowledge and experiences between generations, and it can lead to greater understanding and compassion. A social studies education teaches students how to evaluate different perspectives, assess the validity of evidence, work in groups and apply facts and decision-making. This subject matter prepares students to succeed in our nation's democracy, economy and workforce while promoting long-standing American values of diversity, tolerance and inclusion. Importantly, our instructional resources focus on factors that help unite—rather than divide—the American people.

Legacy stories contribute to our nation's social fabric. These stories are permanently stored and easily accessed on our Web-based Heritage Honor Roll and on the home pages of our Legacy Partners. Many of them illustrate the role immigrants have played and continue to play in our nation's growth. Other stories highlight the contributions of our nation's military, first responders, seniors and ethnic and cultural groups.

PTSA and school clubs work with Americans All to contact small businesses and enroll them as Business Legacy Partners for an annual fee of \$98. School receives **\$15 per year** from each new or renewed membership. After the individual free registration is completed, members have the option to enroll in the Social Legacy Network for discounts on goods and services from business partners for only \$4 per month after a free 3-month trial.

Schools can also create unlimited home pages (in multiple languages, if desired) to host stories about their club and team members. They also receive **\$1 per month** from each new or renewed Social Legacy Network membership. Students helping others write stories can demonstrate to prospective employers and postsecondary institutions their commitment to community service.



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
