Benefits of Storytelling for Students

Storytelling benefits high school students who are participating in non-curriculum school activities, as well as in their personal lives.

- Stories begin at birth, and *legacies* are built each time a personal, academic or professional milestone is achieved. Every student has important experiences and lessons learned to share with family, friends and future generations. Creating and publishing a [story](#) about themselves helps students develop skills in critical thinking, communicating, researching and, especially, writing—skills needed to help ensure their success in college and/or the workforce.
- Students can use their story to create virtual yearbooks for all the clubs and teams they participate in. If they already have created a story, they can repurpose it by adding additional photographs and other media, and publish it in multiple languages. This will give them a permanent, accessible social media presence that truly describes who they are.
- Storytelling can also be a wonderful intergenerational bonding experience that builds empathy, compassion and understanding. By helping others less skilled in the art of writing and the use of technology to incorporate images and recordings into their legacy stories, a student can earn [service-learning](#) credits.
- [Students will find it easy to start creating their life stories. Our template only requires individuals to fill in their name, date of birth and a summary not to exceed 60 words. Additional story text, hyperlinks and photographs can be added over time.](#)
- Helping others create a story also demonstrates to prospective employers and postsecondary institutions a student's character and appreciation for how volunteerism benefits a community.

Even though Americans All is no longer active in any curriculum arena, members can access our online K–12, nonpolitical supplemental [classroom resources](#) presented in multiple perspectives, which were sold to more than 2,000 [schools](#) and libraries nationwide.

Benefits of Storytelling for Students' Families and Their PTA

Storytelling helps families pass on knowledge and experiences to current and future generations. [Research](#) by the National Library of Medicine has shown that patterns of memory sharing begin early in one's life, informing relationships, one's history, and one's sense of cultural belonging. Intergenerational knowledge of one's family history is associated with [positive mental health, wholeness and well-being](#). Life stories are central to one's sense of self and the social world that they inhabit. Indeed, considerable research indicates that storytelling is fundamental to human development, cultural frameworks, and the cultivation of relationships. And by sharing stories, we can all recognize the contributions of every individual, reinforcing the values of diversity and respect, and promote tolerance, acceptance, empathy, and understanding. This can help our increasingly polarized communities and nation focus on commonalities, rather than differences.

PTA organizations support schools in getting both unrestricted funds and resources. We can fill this dual role by providing them with a program—our Heritage Honor Roll and Legacy Partner landing pages—to add as a fundraising tool. In addition, many of the members of the PTA (as well as other school families) own or participate in local businesses and as professional service providers and can use this program to gain additional exposure and reach a larger audience for their entities.

How to register for Americans All

1. Visit www.americansall.org and click on the “Create New User Account” tab at the top right of the home page to register for a free “User Account”. This gives you access to your personalized “Welcome Back” page that contains links to program benefits. [Tutorials](#) are provided to assist individuals in navigating the site and taking advantage of its many benefits. A list is provided at the end of this tutorial.



2. If an individual is now affiliated, or plans to be affiliated, with a K–12 public or private school or any other education organization, he or she can become a lifetime member of Americans All at no cost. As such, he or she can create and publish a free story on the Americans All Heritage Honor Roll.
3. Click on “Register for Americans All” on your Welcome Back” page. This will enable you to select the template for either an individual or a group story, and you can register you for your one-year free trail in our Social Legacy Network to obtain discounts on goods and services from our from our program members.

Heritage Honor Roll Legacy Story, Individuals or Groups

Individuals or Groups become lifetime members of Americans All for free if they, or any member of their family, is or was affiliated (or plans to be affiliated) with a K–12 public, private or alternative school that is registered, or plans to be registered, for our program. If this is not the case, they can enroll in Americans All at the discounted registration fee of \$24.50. One of the main benefits of membership is creating and publishing a legacy story on an individual or a group and sharing it forever on our web-based Heritage Honor Roll. Businesses and Nonprofit Legacy Partners

Schools

A point of contact is required to act as an agent for a school so he or she can register the school and create and publish a free story on the school on our web-based Heritage Honor Roll. The story can be published in multiple languages, if desired, and can be enhanced through photographs, movies and other audio and video media. Even though Americans All is no longer active in the Social Studies, English-Language-Arts, or any curriculum arena, students participating in non-academic activities can access our online K–12 nonpolitical supplemental background [resources](#) presented in multiple . . .

Use this template to create your honoree’s legacy story in English. Once it is published in the Heritage Honor Roll, use the link under “Actions” on your “Welcome Back” page to “Create a legacy story in an additional language.”

By capturing the text in all fields — except “Middle Name” and (Maiden Name) — on this template, our “Search Engine” will make it easier for you to find your story. You can add a new story at any time, first or last, to your list. To add a new story, click on the “Add New Story” button. You can also add the text for a new story to an existing story.

To ensure that your story is published correctly, please double-check the text for errors. You can correct errors in your story at any time. However, you cannot change the text of a story after it has been published. If you have a question about the template, please contact us.

We can help you with any questions you have. Put the words “To come” in the text field to activate it since this is a required field.

After the legacy story is created, you can click on “Create a legacy story in an additional language” on your “Welcome Back” page to work on a second story. After selecting the new language (including English for the second story), the template for your original story will appear. Simply delete (or type over) the text in each field and add the new text for the additional story. Members can create as many new stories in foreign languages as they desire. However, the same foreign language cannot be used more than one time, unless otherwise noted on the list.

After each additional story is created and published, a new link will appear on your “Welcome Back” page, so you can modify the story anytime, for free. All previous versions of the story will be archived.

Note: Each time you change your honoree’s legacy story, you must click on “Publish My Story” or “Save My Work.”

Example of an individual story from our Heritage Honor Roll

Allan S. Kullen *Author, Business Printer, Social Entrepreneur, Traveler*



Allan S. Kullen / February 20, 1942 - ? Author

"Her name is Ester Baumgartner. Do you know her?" Allan Kullen had posed the question in a broken mixture of Hebrew and English to whoever would listen and could understand him. Allan had met Ester while on an archaeological dig at [Masada](#) in Negev, Israel. All he knew by the time they parted ways was her name and the fact that she was staying in Tel Aviv. So, after finishing his work, he decided he would try to find her. He hitchhiked his way to Tel Aviv and, despite all odds, found her. It was to play an important role in his life.

Allan was born in Washington, DC, on February 20, 1942, to Eunice (Statland) and Sol [Kullen](#), both originally from Baltimore, MD. His sister, Marian, was born two years later. He grew up in the DC metropolitan area. His father had built a successful career in the printing industry so, in 1959 after a very uneventful four years culminating in his high school graduation, Allan chose to attend the School of Printing Management at [Carnegie Institute of Technology](#) (CIT) in Pittsburgh, PA.

Americans All features photographs and texts on the contributions that immigrants made to the nation's development when they come through Ellis Island. At the same time, he was printing for the [Coordinating Committee for Ellis Island](#), a nonprofit group focused on the same topic. This action rekindled the passion generated by his travels abroad, and he founded and became president of the People of America Foundation and became co-

photographs, simulations and teacher's guides, all developed by a team of scholars led by Americans All co-developer [Dr. Gail C. Christopher](#). Although Americans All was well received by the education community, its appeal was limited to classrooms devoted to teaching social studies. However, all text is filtered through a third party, secure Profanity App to ensure that they do not contain inappropriate language. - We comply with the "Children's Online Privacy Protection Act" of 1998 and therefore disallow children under 13 from putting personal information on our site.





A Champion for Social History

Allan Kullen

February 20, 1942 -

Allan Kullen was born on February 20, 1942, in Washington, DC, and grew up in the area. His father had success in the printing industry, so Allan chose to attend the Carnegie Institute of Technology in Pittsburgh, PA, after graduating from high school in 1959. He graduated from its School of Printing Management in 1963.

To gain more business training, Allan then entered an MBA program at the University of California, Berkeley. During his first year, he met representatives of NBBS, a Dutch travel organization that organized student trips to Europe, and began putting out a daily newspaper for the eight-day crossing by sea. He also accepted an internship as a consultant for a printing company in Amsterdam. That fall, rather than returning home, he traveled extensively where, for the first time, he recognized the contributions that diverse cultures make to world history. Allan subsequently decided to enter the workforce rather than resume his schooling at Berkeley.

He began his career as marketing director for his father's printing firm, Kaufmann Press, Inc. When his father's company was acquired by a public company, Publisher's Company, Inc. (Pubco), he went to work for Pubco, first assisting with its acquisitions program and later joining its publishing division. When Pubco began to fail, Allan realized he needed to build a future where he could better control his own destiny, especially since he was now married to the former Diane Klein and they had two children, Allison and Todd. In 1974, he acquired the assets of a struggling printing company and formed Todd Allan Printing Co., Inc., which he ran until 2013. During that period, he grew the company through internal sales and roll-up acquisitions of eight smaller firms, at its peak achieving \$16 million in annual sales and employing 127.

While working at Pubco, he observed that some of its large printing vendors also owned commercial educational properties, and he brought that manufacturing strategy to Todd Allan. He set up his own publishing company in the early 1980s by buying a program called *The First Experience*, which featured photographs and texts on the contributions that immigrants entering through Ellis Island made to our nation's development. At the same time, he was printing for the Coordinating Committee for Ellis Island, a similarly focused nonprofit group.

Drawing inspiration from his extensive travels and reinforcing his interest in history, Allan then founded and became president of the People of America Foundation and became co-developer of its social studies resources program, Americans All. The program includes printed texts and recordings, period-specific posters and photographs, and simulations and teacher's guides, all developed by a team of scholars led by Americans All co-developer Dr. Gail C. Christopher. More recent program components support excellence in social studies instruction by increasing access to high-quality resources for classrooms and professional development opportunities for teachers.







The following tutorials will help you create and publish your legacy story. You can update your story anytime, for free; all previous versions are archived.

There are four major roles that Americans All members can have. A person (an individual or a group for which he/she is affiliated), a nonprofit organization, a school or education (a specific form of a nonprofit organization), and a business or professional service provider (and their respective offices and locations). A person can also be an agent (or Point of Contact) for a nonprofit or business member but must register separately using that organization's email address. Registration tutorials for each of the roles are below.
