About Americans All

[Americans All](#) (a program of a 36-year-old nonprofit) has developed a unique, multi-purpose, multi-media [storytelling](#) tool that benefits three separate, but interconnected, groups: students (create virtual yearbooks for clubs and teams they participate in, and access discounts); schools (a turnkey revenue generator), and local business/ professional service providers (additional exposure). Our web-based app is free; easy to install, access and update; and the multi-media stories can be published in multiple languages.

Storytelling helps families pass on knowledge and experiences to current and future generations. [Research](#) by the National Library of Medicine has shown that patterns of memory sharing begin early in one's life, informing relationships, one's history, and one's sense of cultural belonging. Intergenerational knowledge of one's family history is associated with [positive mental health, wholeness and a sense of well-being](#). Life stories are central to one's sense of self and the social world that they inhabit. Indeed, considerable research indicates that storytelling is fundamental to human development, cultural frameworks, and the cultivation of relationships. And by sharing stories, we can all recognize the contributions of every individual, reinforcing the values of diversity and respect, and promote tolerance, acceptance, empathy, and understanding. This can help our increasingly polarized communities and nation focus on commonalities, rather than differences.

If students have already created a story, they can repurpose it by adding additional photographs and other media, and publish it in multiple languages. This will give them a permanent, accessible social media presence that truly describes who they are. They can also use this tool to demonstrate their understanding and appreciation for the value of community service and volunteerism—which is often needed for graduation—by helping less skilled individuals create and publish their stories, thus enriching the history of their communities. Storytelling can be a wonderful intergenerational bonding experience.

Americans All desires to host well-written and documented research, especially stories that feature individuals or groups that make up local histories. Our goal is to house one of our nation's most comprehensive and non-political databases of individual and group stories, past and present, about the [Peopling of America](#). Moreover, our student members and their families can receive discounts on goods and services from local businesses and professional service providers through our Social Legacy Network, which is free for students until they graduate. After that, they can subscribe to the Network for a small monthly fee to continue receiving business discounts and other program benefits.

School Nonprofit Legacy Partners (SNLPs) participate in Americans All at no cost because they host, on their free Legacy Partner landing page(s) on our website, [legacy stories](#) that members have published on our Heritage Honor Roll to provide further exposure for these stories. These landing page(s)—one for each team or club and in multiple languages, if desired—share information about the entity and help it better connect with current and future members.

All Legacy Partners receive a 6-digit ID Number when they [register](#) so their members and friends can easily find them on our site by putting the word “node” and that ID number after our web address—www.americansall.org/node/xxxxxx.

SNLPs are listed on our Legacy Partner landing page and can be searched by name, language, category and location. To help individuals and groups that share a common interest but are not represented by a national organization, such as families of Covid-19 victims and First Responders, and to consolidate stories on historically relevant topics, we have added landing pages for these [issues/topics](#) in our Legacy Partner section. If an individual or a group creates a story about an issue/topic we have not identified, notify us via our [Contact](#) page and we can create a landing page for that issue/topic.

The [Ancient Order of Hibernians \(AOH\)](#) is America's oldest and largest Irish Catholic organization. It is made up of Irish and Irish-Americans dedicated to the promotion, protection and preservation of Irish culture and traditions in America.

Founded in 1836 in New York and Pennsylvania to defend immigrant Irish from intolerance by nativist [Know-Nothings](#), they followed the Irish across the new nation providing welfare benefits to members and protection to their church growing, as they went, into a national organization.

The heroism of the Irish units in the [American Civil War](#) had America cheering for the sons of Erin in American uniform while the charms of Irish domestics were winning admirers on the home front. The result was a decrease in prejudice against the Irish, and the Know-Nothing movement, recognized for the bigoted group it was, faded away. The AOH, on the other hand, grew stronger as they worked their way across America. A Ladies Auxiliary was started in 1906 and incorporated as the [Ladies AOH](#) in 2004.

In more recent years, reduced anti-Catholic violence minimized the militancy of the AOH and allowed an increase in cultural and charitable activity. Today they support community charities of all religions and ethnic origins while preserving Ireland's ancient heritage. Annual dances, concerts, and parades sponsored at all levels of the Order raise millions for charity while providing a showcase for the positive contributions the Irish have made in every walk of American life. Hibernian Halls across the country also provide a welcome for new immigrants where the unique interests of the Irish are fostered, making the AOH a home away from home for many. Information for a team or club point of contact

By creating a nonprofit school landing page for your team or club, you can now host stories from our Heritage Honor Roll created by your members and other individuals that support your team or club. As the point of contact (poc), can create and publish this landing page, at no cost, in as many foreign languages as you desire.

A landing page can become an annual virtual yearbook. Since these pages are electronic, they are easy to access at any time and in any place, and if students keep their stories updated, it will be easy for members of each club or team to stay current on the activities of their classmates.

Each account has its own email address and a unique password. The account can be managed by an officer of the team or club, and when he/she moves on, the new officer can take it over either keep the same password or create a new password if desired. This will not affect the stories hosted on the pages. For sports teams (because of their size), it may be better to have a permanent member of the coaching staff set up its own free Americans All account. In either case, please make sure that a permanent member of the school staff also has the password to ensure that it is not lost.

Once a landing page has been created, the poc, now or at any time, can create and publish two stories in English and as many in multiple languages on your school as you desire. The stories can include text, photographs, movies and other audio and video media, and include hyperlinks to other Web sites. Although part of any story can be password protected, if desired, this would not be applicable to a school. The legacy story will be published on our Heritage Honor Roll and can be added to your own Legacy Partner landing page. You can update the story, for free, at any time, or can have a new story each year by setting up a new account. The original story will remain on our website.

An individual can be point of contact for multiple Legacy Partners but each legacy partner must have a separate email address.

Your participation in our program supports students participating in non-curriculum school activities.

Note: The point of contact can set up his/her own free Americans All account, using their own email address. To learn how, visit www.americansall.org/node/566544.

How to create a School Nonprofit Legacy Partner landing page

The entity must have a Point of Contact (agent) to set up a free landing page and later, its stories for the Heritage Honor Roll. Use the nonprofit's email address, not the email address of the point of contact. We have created tutorials to help guide you through each step. For your convenience, links to these tutorials are included at the end of this document. When creating a story for the Heritage Honor Roll, use the entity's email address.

Step 1: Visit www.americansall.org and click on the “**Create New User Account**” tab at the top right of the home page to register for Americans All.

Inside the new folder, create additional folders to house all the images and the text you may want to use for your story. You can then easily cut/page the text into the template.

Become a Legacy Partner

Business Legacy Partners

Remove or Reinstate a Legacy Story

Americans All members can select as many Legacy Partners landing pages as they choose to host their Heritage Honor Roll story. These are organizations with which they or their honorees are affiliated. However, Legacy Partners maintain the right to accept or remove a legacy story.

By clicking on the "Edit my Legacy Partner landing page" link under the "Actions" tab on your "Welcome Back" page, you will be taken to a page to remove or reinstate a legacy story as well as update your Legacy Partner landing page.

If your landing page is open when a legacy story is added, the page must be refreshed for the story to appear. Otherwise, it will automatically appear when you log in again.

To remove a story, uncheck the box in front of the honoree's name and click on the "Publish" button. The honoree's name will remain on the page (the box will be unchecked) and the story will not be visible to the public on your landing page. A notice of removal will be automatically sent to the creator of the story.

If the story was removed in error, check on the box in front of the honoree's name and then click on the "Publish" button. A notice of reinstatement will automatically be sent to the creator of the story.

Americans All Website Tutorials

Americans All members will find it easy to start creating their life stories. Our template only requires individuals to fill in their names, pertinent dates and a summary not to exceed 80 words. Additional story text, hyperlinks and photographs can be added over time. The following tutorials will help you create and publish your legacy story. You can update your story at any time, for free, and all previous versions are archived.

There are four major roles that Americans All members can have. A person (an individual or a group for which he/she is affiliated), a nonprofit organization, a school or education (a specific form of a nonprofit organization), and a business or professional service provider (and their respective offices and locations). A person can also be an agent (or Point of Contact) for a nonprofit or business member but must register separately using that organization's email address. Registration tutorials for each of the roles are below.
