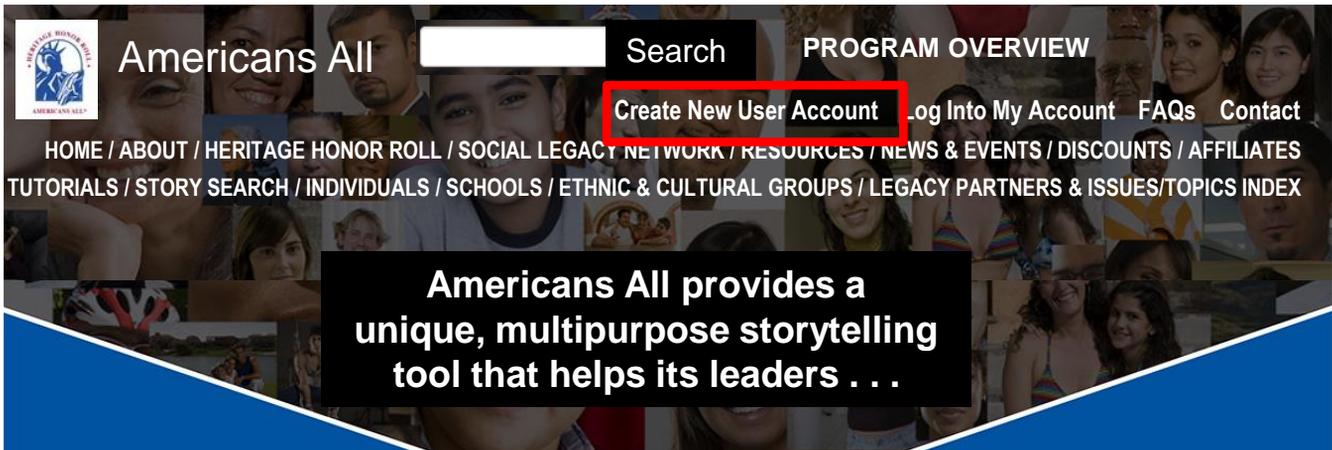

Registration Information for an Individual

1. Click on the link “Create New User Account” at the top of our “Home Page” www.americansall.org to set up a free “New User Account”. This gives you access to your personalized “Welcome Back” page that contains links to obtain program benefits, some of which do not require membership in Americans All (AA).
2. Tutorials are provided to assist individuals in navigating the site and its many benefits. See: <https://americansall.org/page/americans-all-web-site-tutorials>
3. Our program has two main components: Americans All (A) and the Social Legacy Network (SLN). After an individual creates a “New User Account,” they have two options. They can register for a free lifetime membership in AA using their own email address, or become a point of contact for a Legacy Partner Alliance (LPA) entity—a school, nonprofit or a business—using the entity’s email address. AA members can create an individual or a group story for the Heritage Honor Roll (HHR) if they use their own address. An individual can have their own story (using their own email address) and the point of contact for multiple entities, using their unique email address.
3. Lifetime membership in AA includes a three-month free trial in our Social Legacy Network (SLN) which enables them to get discounts on goods and services from our Business Legacy Partners (BLP). Students keep the free trial opportunity until their class graduates. Members do not need to create a story to be part of the SLN.
4. Members will find it easy to start creating their stories. Our template (for either an individual or a group story) only requires individuals to fill in their name, date of birth and a summary not to exceed 60 words to begin the creation process. Importantly, all fields marked with an (*) must include at least one word (like “to come”) to activate the field, thus avoiding an error message. Additional story text, hyperlinks and photographs can be added over time.
5. When filling out the field “Ethnicity and/or culture, country(ies) of origin of grandparent(s), occupation, achievements, contributions” (for an individual story), or “Field/Industry/ Profession/Activity” (for a group story), insert “keywords” that will make it easier for the reader to use our SEARCH feature to locate your story. Those words will appear at the top of the story after the honoree’s name when it is published on the Heritage Honor Roll.
6. After the free trial in our SLN, members have an option to continue receiving discounts from our business partners for a subscription fee of \$4/month, 77% of which is donated to a school of their choice. A second registration form will need to be filled out and will be sent before the trial period ends. **We will not invoice without your permission. We believe the discounts you can receive will more than pay for your membership.**
7. After the legacy story is created, you can click on “Create a legacy story in an additional language” on your “Welcome Back” page if you want to begin working on a second story. After you select the new language (including English for the second story), the template for your original story will appear. Simply delete (or type over) the text in each field and add the new text for the additional story. Members can create as many new stories in foreign languages as they desire. However, the same foreign language cannot be used more than one time.
8. After each additional story is created and published, a new link will appear on your “Welcome Back” page, so you can modify the story anytime, for free. All previous versions of the story will be archived.

Sample Heritage Honor Roll story for an individual

Allan S. Kullien, Author, Publisher



"Her name is Estor Baumgartner. Do you know her?" Allan Kullien had posed the question in a broken mixture of Hebrew and English to whoever would listen and could understand him. Allan had met Estor while on an archaeological dig at *Massada* in Negev, Israel. All he knew by the time they parted ways was her name and the fact that she was staying in Tel Aviv. So, after finishing his work, he decided he would try to find her. He hitchhiked his way to Tel Aviv and, despite all odds, found her. It was to play an important role in his life.

Allan S. Kullien, February 20, 1942 - 2016

Allan was born in Washington, DC, on February 20, 1942, to Eunice (Stalband) and Sol Kullien, both originally from Baltimore, MD. His sister, Marian, was born two years later. He grew up in the DC metropolitan area. His father had built a successful career in the printing industry so, in 1959, after a very uneventful four years culminating in his high school graduation, Allan chose to attend the School of Printing Management at *Carnegie Institute of Technology* (CIT) in Pittsburgh, PA. Americans All features photographs and texts on the contributions that immigrants made to the nation's development when they come through Ellis Island. At the same time, he was printing for the *Coordinating Committee for Ellis Island*, a nonprofit group focused on the same topic. This action rekindled the passion generated by his travels abroad, and he founded and became president of the People of America Foundation and became co-developer of its signature resource program, Americans All. The program consisted of printed texts and recordings, period-specific posters and photographs, simulations and teacher's guides, all developed by a team of scholars led by Americans All co-developer *Dr. Gail C. Christopher*. Although Americans All was well received by the education community, its appeal was limited to classrooms devoted to teaching social studies. With the national emphasis shifting to support STEM programs, his foundation (Note: This story was excerpted and edited from an interview by Gordon Bernardi, author of *Profiles in Success* (Volume 6): Inspiration from Executive Leaders in the Washington D.C. Area.)

Cox-Hyson Home, Smithville, TX *Historic Building*



Cox-Hyson Home, Smithville, TX [Smithville Heritage Society] (c.1908-?) Historic Building

As a Bicentennial gift and through the generosity of Floyd R. "Skip" Hyson and his wife, Lucille, the newly-organized Smithville Heritage Society received the Cox-Hyson house as a permanent home for the Society in 1976. Built in 1908 for John Cox and his wife, Irene Wilkes Cox, the house was the family home of the John Cox family. Following John's untimely death in 1916, the house passed to his wife Irene, then their daughter Lillian Cox Hyson in 1921, upon Lillian's death in 1976, the house went to her son, "Skip" Hyson, who then donated the house to the Smithville Heritage Society.

The home is listed on the *National Register of Historic Places* and has remained mostly unchanged since it was built except for minor interior changes and necessary restoration and maintenance work done by the Heritage Society. It sits in exactly the same location as when built. The wrap-around porch and tall Ionic columns with decorative corbels remind us of a typical two-story, early 1900s Victorian house, neo-classical in style. It is not "high Victorian," but "transitional," characterized by wide verandas and wrap around porches, tall windows, and rooms with pocket doors. A white picket fence once enclosed the property in its early years.

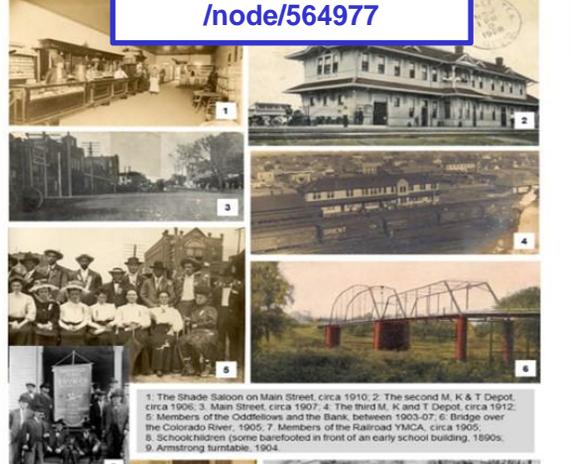
On the first floor, there is a formal entry, parlor, dining room, bathroom, country kitchen and an enclosed porch, once a sleeping porch. The living room is on the second floor.

A Champion for Social History

Allan Kullien
February 20, 1942 -

Allan Kullien was born on February 20, 1942, in Washington, DC, and grew up in the area. His father had access to the printing industry, so Allan chose to attend the *Carnegie Institute of Technology* in Pittsburgh, PA, after graduating from high school in 1959. He graduated from its *School of Printing Management* in 1963.

To gain more business training, Allan then entered an MBA program at the *University of California, Berkeley*. During his first year, he met representatives of NEDS, a Dutch civil organization that organized student trips to Europe, and began printing out a daily newspaper for the eight-day crossing by sea. He also accepted an internship as a consultant for a printing company in Amsterdam. That fall, rather than returning home, he traveled extensively.

First time, he recognized the contributions that diverse cultures make to world history. Allan decided to enter the workforce rather than resume his schooling at Berkeley career as marketing director for his father's printing firm, *Kullien Press, Inc.* When his father's acquired by a public company, *Publinter Publishing Co., Inc.* (Publinter), he went to work for Publinter, first its acquisition program and later joining its publishing division. When Publinter began to fail, Allan needed to build a future where he could better control his own destiny, especially since he was now a former *Diase Klein* and they had two children, Allison and Todd. In 1974, he accepted the assets of a printing company and formed *Todd Allan Printing Co., Inc.*, which he ran until 2013. During that period, company through internal sales and roll-up acquisitions of eight smaller firms, at its peak achieving annual sales and employing 127.

At Publinter, he observed that some of its large printing vendors also owned commercial educational sites to teach manufacturing strategy to Todd Allan. He set up his own publishing company in the by buying a program called *The First Experience*, which featured photographs and texts on the that immigrants entering through Ellis Island and made to our nation's development. Insulation from his extensive travels and reinforcing his interest in history, Allan then founded and led of the *People of America Foundation* and became a co-developer of its social studies resources *Americans All*. The program includes printed texts and recordings, period-specific posters and and an *Immigrants and Teacher's Guide*, all developed by a team of scholars led by Americans All co-developer *Dr. Gail C. Christopher*. More recent program components support excellence in social studies increasing access to high-quality resource for classrooms and professional development for teachers.

To ensure the legacy stories published on our Heritage Honor Roll do not contain inappropriate language, all text is filtered through a secure, third-party Profanity App. If a word or phrase used in your story is on its "block" list, you will receive an error message at the top of the template when you click on the "Publish My Story" button. If that occurs, replace the word or phrase by using its first and last letters and put an "x" for each letter in between, such as "sxxt" or "fxkx you."

We can override the App's list of blocked words. If you believe the "blocked" word is appropriate, contact us by e-mail. Put the word "Profanity" in the subject line. In the body of the e-mail, identify the "blocked word or phrase" and include the sentence in which it is used. If our editorial board agrees that the word or phrase is appropriate, we will remove the word or phrase from the App's block list and notify you so you can insert the desired word or phrase in your story.

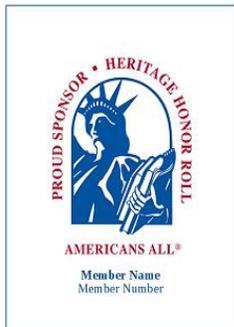

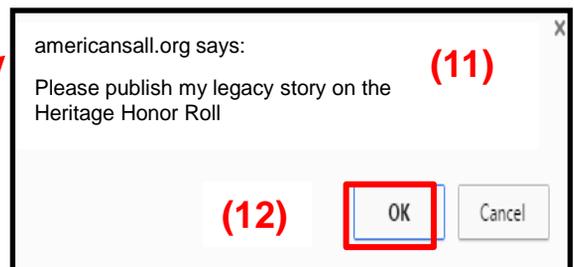

There are four major roles that Americans All members can have. A person can also be an agent (or Point of Contact) for a nonprofit or business member but must register separately using that organization's email address.
