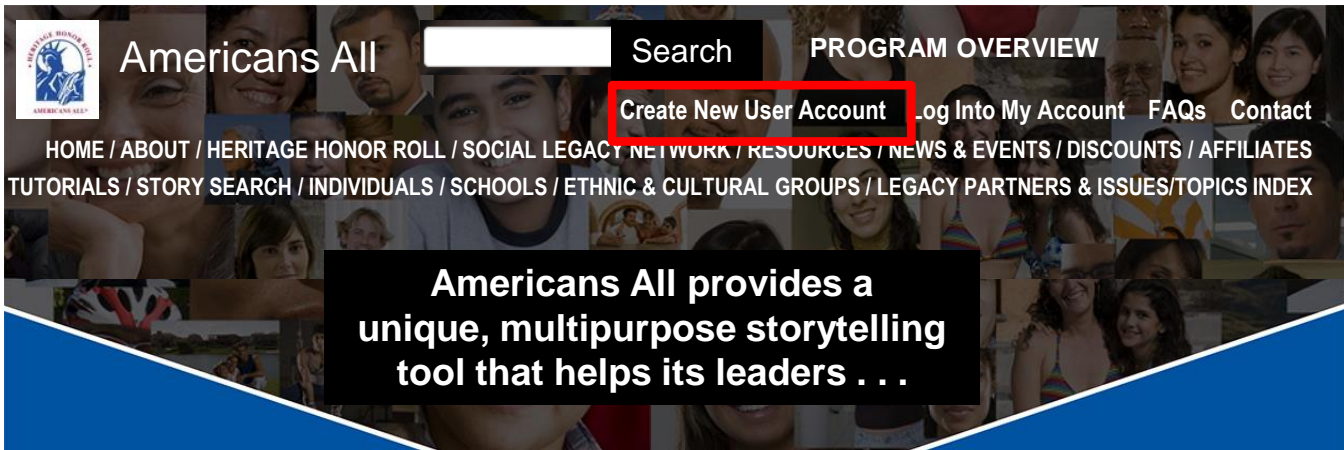

Registration Information for a Nonprofit's Point of Contact (poc)

1. Click on the "Create New User Account" link at the top of our "Homepage" americansall.org to set up a free "New User Account". This gives you access to your personalized "Welcome Back" page that contains links to obtain all program benefits. If the individual is registering to become a poc for a nonprofit, they must use the nonprofit's email address (which is how we identify our members). An individual can be a poc for more than one entity, since each entity will have its own email address. The individual can later register for AA using their own email other address.
2. Our program has three main components: a free, lifetime membership in AA to create a story for the Heritage Honor Roll (HHR); the Social Legacy Network (SLN), whose members receive discounts and access to all content; and the Legacy Partner Alliance which is composed of nonprofits and schools, plus businesses and professional service providers, who provide the discounts on goods and services to our SLN members. All AA members are given a free 3-month subscription to the SLN. After it expires, members (individuals and the poc acting on behalf of the entities) have an option to continue that subscription for a fee of \$4 per month, 77 percent of which is donated to a school of their choice. We believe that the member will gain more in discounts than they pay in their monthly fee. A nonprofit, which, for our purposes, is a group of individuals (either incorporated or officially organized) that can take advantage of this benefit through their poc. AA members do not have to create a story to be part of the SLN.
3. The first step for a nonprofit is to appoint a poc to fill out its registration information and create the nonprofit's landing page (LP). For continuity, the poc should be a permanent employee of the nonprofit because only they can create and update the LP and its HHR stories.
4. After an entity becomes a LP and has created its landing page, its poc can then register the entity for AA, using the entity's email address so its poc can create the entity's story, in multiple languages and augmented with images, photographs and multi-media links, for the HHR and obtain discounts from our business partners. The stories can be about the entity or its founder. The 6-digit ID Number will be different for the Legacy Partner and its AA story. Importantly, we do not share, sell or publish personal contact information. Although the poc's name is on the nonprofits Legacy Partner registration form, it does not appear when that page is published.
5. Tutorials are provided to assist nonprofits in navigating the site and its various functions.

6. Nonprofits (schools are a special type of nonprofit since they receive income) participate in AA at no cost because they host, on their free LP landing page(s) [stories](#) that their members, staff and associates have published on our HHR to provide further exposure for these stories. These landing page(s)—one for each chapter/division/office and in multiple languages, if desired—also share information about the organization and help it better connect with current and future members. The poc should ensure that the nonprofit's 6-digit LP ID Number is made available to its membership and staff so they can add their stories to the page.



Create New User Account

American All (AA) is a nonprofit community outreach and empowerment program. Our revenue-generating multipurpose storytelling tool helps leaders, at all levels, improve the mental, social and economic health of their constituents. The program uses a unique storytelling tool and its [Social Legacy Network](#) (SLN) to benefit students, community members, nonprofits, schools and local businesses—both socially and economically. It has two main components: a [Heritage Honor Roll](#) (HHR) that hosts stories created by its members, and [Legacy Partner](#) (LP) landing pages for businesses and nonprofits to share information about themselves, and if desired, host stories created by our members.

Lifetime membership in AA is free for all individuals, and it includes a three-month free trial in our SLN which enables them to get discounts on goods and services from our Business Legacy Partners (BLP). Students keep the free trial opportunity until their class graduates. After the trial period, AA members have the option to subscribe to our SLN for \$4 per month, cancelable at any time, to continue receiving discounts; 77 percent of their gross subscription fee is donated to a school or education organization they designate. If the school is not registered, the funds are donated to their district. It is anticipated that members will subscribe since they should gain more in discounts than the cost of their subscription. If a member does not opt to join the SLN, their lifetime membership in Americans All is unaffected.

Members will never be automatically billed for the optional Social Legacy Network fee after their free trial and can cancel their subscription at any time once they subscribe. No credit card is required to be put on file for the free trial. In addition, we do not store credit card data, share or sell our members' contact information, allow pop-up ads or of AI.

Stories on our HHR can be autobiographical or about individuals, families, groups or issues/topics, contain up to 2,000 words (1,000 can be password protected for privacy), and be augmented with images, logos, hyperlinks, photographs, and audio-video media. They can also be published in [multiple languages](#). In addition, membership includes creating a second story in English.

All stories can be easily updated and we archive all prior versions archived. Stories can be started by filling in only a few required fields and then be completed over time. In addition, members can also create a shorter version (up to 500 words) which can be printed in an 8½” x 11” format. Finally, AA provides step-by-step tutorials and easy-to-use templates to simplify the creative process.

What makes our program even more unique is that we include [historical information](#) to provide context for these stories and the experiences, observations and accomplishments reflected in them. Even though AA is no longer active in curriculum arenas, our online K–12 nonpolitical supplemental [classroom resources](#) presented in multiple perspectives, which were sold to more than 2,000 [schools](#) and libraries nationwide remain our site.

Storytelling helps families pass on knowledge and experiences to current and future generations. [Research](#) by the National Library of Medicine has shown that patterns of memory sharing begin early in one’s life, informing relationships, one’s history, and one’s sense of cultural belonging. Intergenerational knowledge of one’s family history is associated with [positive mental health, wholeness and well-being](#). Life stories are central to one’s sense of self and the social world that they inhabit. Indeed, considerable research indicates that storytelling is fundamental to human development, cultural frameworks, and the cultivation of relationships.

A message has been sent to your email address to create a password for your account. That password (which we do not keep) will complete your registration. To ensure that the integrity of our program is not breached, that email has a link for you to use to get to the "Create your password" page. Like the "Captcha" on your registration page, this is another way for us to block hackers from registering for Americans All. Once your registration is complete, you can begin accessing all program benefits by creating a new tab on your browser and inserting your email address and password to log back into Americans All. That will take you to your customized "Welcome Back" page which contains links to all program benefits and features.

Note:

I want to reinforce our promise not to share or sell any of the contact information you provide during the registration process. Your email address (which you use to log into Americans All) is used by us only to identify your account and your Zip Code enables us to know how many unnamed members we have in each geographic area. The free lifetime membership in Americans All enables you to create stories--in multiple languages, if desired--to be published on our Heritage Honor Roll.

During this pilot program, your membership in Americans All also includes a free, 3-month trial subscription to our Social Legacy Network. (Students maintain their membership until their class graduates.) This enables you to receive discounts on goods and services from local businesses and professional service providers. Knowing how many unnamed members we have in each geographic area is valuable data for us to share with local businesses to encourage them to participate, and we donate 77 percent of their membership fee to a school of their choice. After the trial period, our members have the option to subscribe to our SLN for \$4 per month, cancelable at any time, to continue receiving discounts. Moreover, 77 percent of their gross subscription fee is also donated to a school or education organization they designate. It is anticipated that members will subscribe since they should gain more in discounts than the cost of their subscription.

Heritage Honor Roll Legacy Story, Individuals or Groups

Individuals or Groups become lifetime members of Americans All for free. A main benefit of membership is the ability to create and publish two stories in English—and as many as desired in multiple languages—for our Heritage Honor Roll. You will also receive a one-year free trial subscription in our Social Legacy Network (students keep their free trial until their class graduates). Your subscription enables you to receive discounts on program materials.

Americans All membership requires individuals to fill in the honoree's name, date of birth (and date of passing, if appropriate) and a summary not to exceed 60 words. Legacy story text, hyperlinks, photographs, and audio and video media can be added over time. The story can be updated for free and a shortened version can be printed on an 8½" x 11" template. To ensure privacy, part of the legacy story can be password protected. To provide additional story exposure, members can post it on the landing page as many of our Legacy Partners as desired. Where applicable, students can earn college service-learning credits by participating in our program. . . .

Businesses and Nonprofit Legacy Partners

A point of contact is required to act as an agent so it can create a free landing page—in multiple languages if desired—on its entity. They can generate landing page(s)—in multiple languages, if desired—for each location or chapter/district on our website to share information about themselves, better connect with their clients and members and demonstrate their commitment to strengthening communities. They can use their landing page(s) to host legacy stories published on our Heritage Honor Roll by those important to them, thus providing further exposure for these stories. Business Legacy Partners also offer discounts on goods and services with other Legacy Partners and subscribers to our Social Legacy Network. Businesses pay a fee of \$98 per year; 77 percent is donated to a school of their choice.

Schools

A point of contact is required to act as an agent for a school so it can create a free landing page—in multiple languages if desired—on our website. This enables it to receive funds from our Business Legacy partners. The school has the [option](#) of allowing stories to be posted on their landing page. The point of contact can also create and publish free stories on the school on our web-based Heritage Honor Roll. The story can be published in multiple languages, if desired, and can be enhanced through photographs, and audio and video media. The [Ancient Order of Hibernians \(AOH\)](#) is America's oldest and largest Irish Catholic organization. It is made up of Irish and Irish-Americans dedicated to the promotion, protection and preservation of Irish culture and traditions in America.

Founded in 1836 in New York and Pennsylvania to defend immigrant Irish from intolerance by nativist [Know-Nothings](#), they followed the Irish across the new nation providing welfare benefits to members and protection to their church growing, as they went, into a national organization.

The heroism of the Irish units in the [American Civil War](#) had America cheering for the sons of Erin in American uniform while the charms of Irish domestics were winning admirers on the home front. The result was a decrease in prejudice against the Irish, and the Know-Nothing movement, recognized for the bigoted group it was, faded away. The AOH, on the other hand, grew stronger as they worked their way across America. A Ladies Auxiliary was started in 1906 and incorporated as the [Ladies AOH](#) in 2004.

In more recent years, reduced anti-Catholic violence minimized the militancy of the AOH and allowed an increase in cultural and charitable activity. Today they support community charities of all religions and ethnic origins while preserving Ireland's ancient heritage. Annual dances, concerts, and parades sponsored at all levels of the Order raise millions for charity while providing a showcase for the positive contributions the Irish have made in every walk of American life. Hibernian Halls across the country also provide a welcome for new immigrants where the unique interests of the Irish are fostered, making the AOH a home away from home for many. Become a Legacy Partner

Legacy Partners are businesses, professional service providers and nonprofit organizations whose missions reinforce our goals of enabling the creation and preservation of legacy stories, acknowledging the contributions of all Americans, supporting non-curricular school activities and helping small businesses succeed. In response to current social issues, we have also made our unique storytelling tool available to support families who have lost a loved one to Covid-19 and to help [unite our nation](#) which has become severely polarized.

All Legacy Partners receive a 6-digit ID Number when they [register](#) so their clients, members, friends and staff can easily find them on our site by putting the word “node” and that ID number after our web address—www.americansall.org/node/xxxxxx. Moreover, Legacy Partners can access Americans All logos and marketing materials to help advertise their membership in our program.

Business Legacy Partners

Business Legacy Partners pay a \$49 fee that is renewable every 6 months. For this fee, you can:

- Receive free landing pages on our Web site—one for each location and in multiple languages, if desired—to share information about your business or practice and advertise discounts for current and future Americans All members.
- Get three additional business accounts at no charge. These can be used for branch offices or to list your business under multiple categories at the same location. Every renewal includes the continuation of the three additional business accounts. The additional accounts register by clicking on the “Add My Location” link on their Welcome Back page.
- Host, on your landing page(s), [legacy stories](#) that customers have published on our Heritage Honor Roll to provide further exposure for these stories. By doing so, you begin creating or expanding an affinity club for your business or practice.
- Be listed on both our [Discounts](#) page and our Legacy Partner landing page, so Americans All members can identify Business Legacy Partners offering discounts on goods and services.

Your participation in Americans All supports social studies education in schools and reinforces your important role in the community.

"Her name is Ester Baumgartner. Do you know her?" Allan Kullen had posed the question in a broken mixture of Hebrew and English to whoever would listen and could understand him. Allan had met Ester while on an archaeological dig at Masada in Neguv, Israel. All he knew by the time they parted ways was her name and the fact that she was staying in Tel Aviv. So, after finishing his work, he decided he would try to find her. He hitchhiked his way to Tel Aviv and, despite all odds, found her. It was to play an important role in his life.

Allan was born in Washington, DC, on February 20, 1942, to Eunice (Stastand) and Sol Kullen, both originally from Baltimore, MD. His sister, Marian, was born two years later. His father had built a successful career in the printing industry so, in 1959 after a very uneventful four years culminating in his high school graduation, Allan chose to attend the School of Printing Management at [Carnegie Institute of Technology](#) (CIT) in Pittsburgh, PA.

Civil War: Fifty-Four Massachusetts Volunteer Infantry Regiment, 54th (Civil War), Glory, Hollowell, Medal of Honor, Military, Shaw, Fort Wagner



On January 26, 1863, Secretary of War Edwin M. Stanton authorized Massachusetts Governor John Albion Andrew to create volunteer companies of artillery "for duty in the forts of Massachusetts and elsewhere, and such corps of infantry for the volunteer military service as he may find convenient. Such volunteers to be enlisted for three years unless sooner discharged, and may include persons of African descent organized into separate corps."

On February 2, the Governor sent a letter to Francis G. Shaw, a prominent Boston abolitionist, to enlist his help in convincing Shaw's son, Captain Robert Gould Shaw, to command the 54th Massachusetts Volunteer Infantry. It would become the first regular army regiment of African-American soldiers raised in the North. Captain Shaw, a commissioned officer in the Union Army, telegraphed his acceptance. Born in Boston on October 10, 1837, and admitted to Harvard College in 1858, Shaw had discontinued his studies in the third year to join the army. He entered the 7th New York National Guard, then received a commission as second lieutenant in the 2nd Massachusetts Infantry, and was later promoted to captain. As a result of his appointment to command the 54th Massachusetts Regiment, he received the rank of colonel.

Once his appointment was confirmed, Shaw began to recruit his soldiers. He was assisted by Lt. Colonel Norwood Hollowell (see his story below) and the regiment became their training at Camp Meigs. Although Shaw was not convinced about the fighting qualities of this new regiment, he was impressed with their dedication and devotion to the task. Throughout his career, he devoted himself to proving that his African

A Champion for Social History

Allan Kullen
February 20, 1942 -

Allan Kullen was born on February 20, 1942, in Washington, DC, and grew up in the area. His father had a successful career in the printing industry, so Allan chose to attend the Carnegie Institute of Technology in Pittsburgh, PA, after graduating from high school in 1959. He graduated from its School of Printing Management in 1963.

To gain more business training, Allan then entered an MBA program at the University of California, Berkeley. During his first year, he met representatives of NEBS, a Dutch travel organization that organized student trips to Europe, and began putting out a daily newspaper for the eight-day crossing by sea. He also accepted an internship as a coordinator for a printing company in Amsterdam. That fall, rather than returning home, he traveled extensively where, for the first time, he recognized the contributions that diverse cultures make to world history. Allan subsequently decided to enter the workforce rather than resume his schooling at Berkeley.

He began his career as a marketing director for his father's printing firm, Kaufmann Press, Inc. When his father's company, Inc. (Pubco), he went to work for Pubco, first as a marketing director. When Pubco began to fail, Allan took control of his own destiny, respectively since he was a partner, Allison and Todd in 1974, he acquired the assets of a printing Co., Inc., which he ran until 2013. During that period, he owned eight smaller firms, all in peak working.

Large printing vendors also owned commercial educational and Todd Allan. He set up his own publishing company in the process, which featured photographs and texts on the end in side to our nation's development. At the same time, he started, a similarly focused nonprofit group.

During his interest in history, Allan then founded and became a co-developer of his social studies resources texts and recordings, period-specific posters and developed by a team of scholars led by Americans All. In corporate support excellence in social studies for classrooms and professional development.

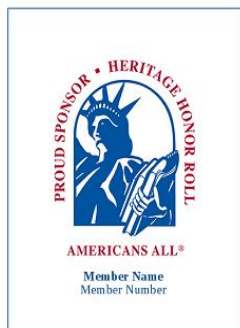

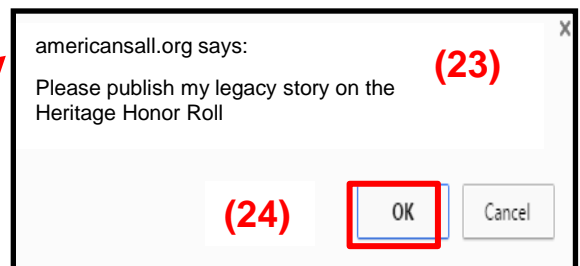
